them.**

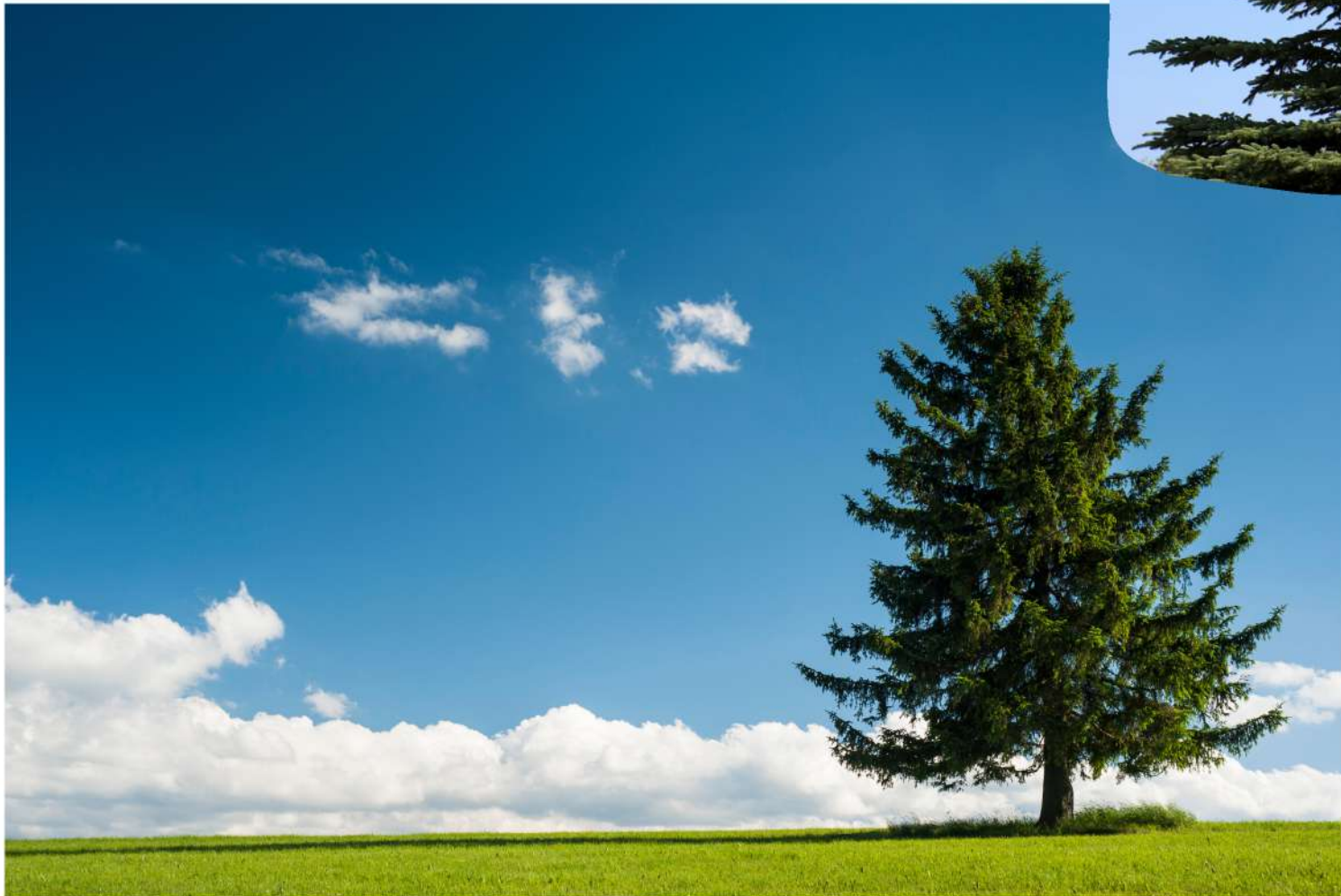
d

m is for mittens.

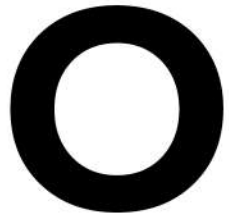


Mittens are
