Bb is for bonfire.



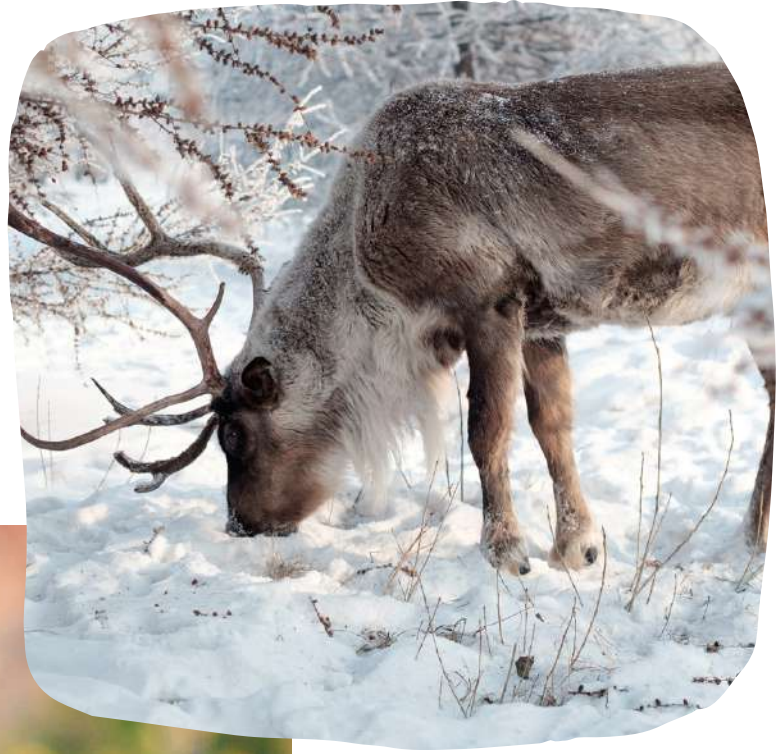
**Bonfires glow

Cc is for costume.



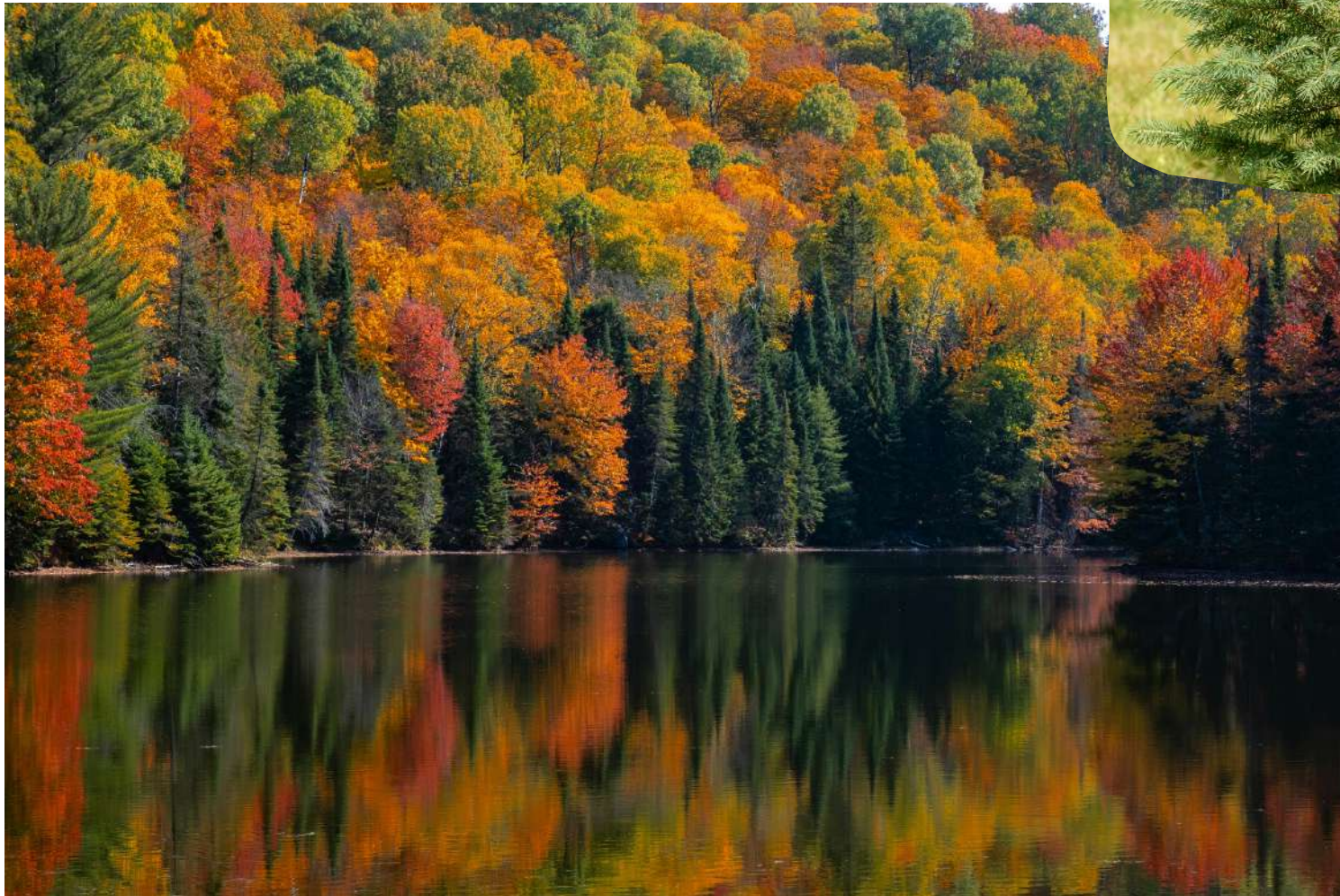
Costumes let kids dress up for Halloween and pretend to be fun, spooky, or silly characters.

the fall.

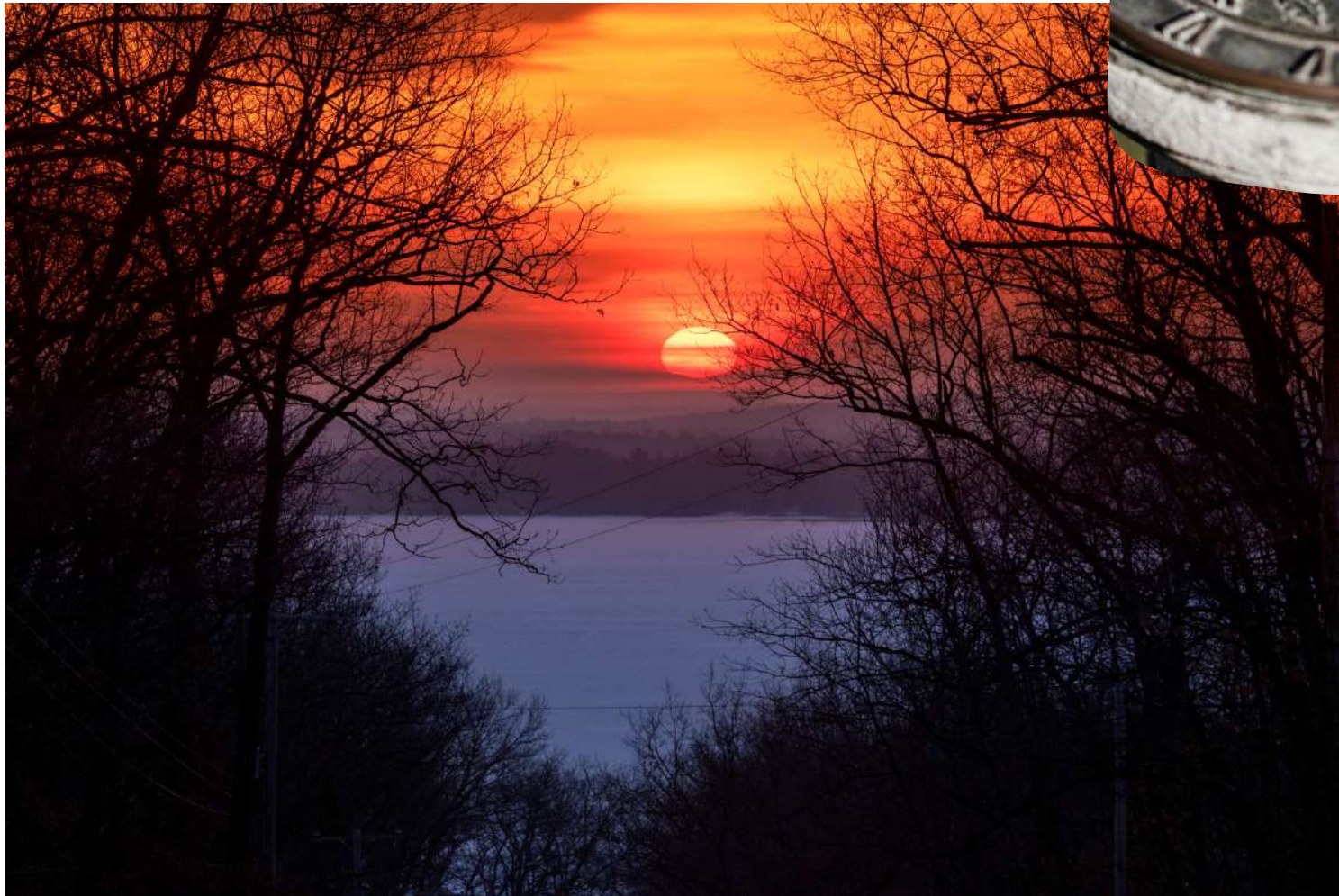
Ww is for web.
