WE RIDE FOR HER

This documentary sheds light on the United States' history of genocide and systemic oppression of Indigenous peoples. It also examines the ongoing crisis of violence against Native women and relatives, as well as the persistent devaluation of their lives and experiences. Eighty-three percent of American Indian and Alaska Native people experience violence in their lifetime, while 80% of sexual violence against them is perpetrated by non-Indigenous people. The vast majority of women and children who endure this violence never see their abusers brought to justice.

This film provides a platform for Indigenous voices to be heard and for our stories to be shared with a wider audience in order to raise awareness, empathy and understanding. I hope our film provides evidence to support policy changes and reform that address the root causes of the crisis and the barriers that we face to seek justice.

Our film is a witness of this moment, serving as a historical record of MMIW/R/P, preserving the stories and experiences of those affected for future generations to learn from and build upon.

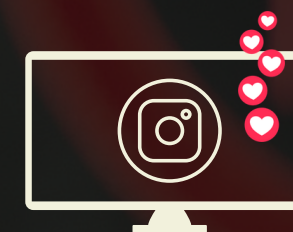
