
Ven. Chariton the Confessor, Abbot of Palestine - September 28, 2025

Saint Chariton the Confessor was born at Iconium in the province of Lycaonia, and suffered there during a persecution against Christians in the reign of Emperor Aurelian (270-275). The example of the holy Protomartyr Thekla (September 24), who had also been a native of his city, encouraged him to confess Christ.

Saint Chariton staunchly confessed faith in the one True God, Christ the Savior. The holy Confessor underwent fierce tortures but, by God's Providence, he survived. The persecution ended after Aurelian's death in 275.

After arriving at Jerusalem on a pilgrimage to the holy places, he fell into the hands of thieves. They tied him up and threw him in a cave, intending to kill him later. But a snake poisoned the water supply and the thieves died. Having buried the thieves and distributed their hidden treasure to those in need and to churches, Chariton continued living the monastic life in the cave they had intended to kill him in.

People came to his cave for guidance, and the monastery known as the Pharan Lavra began. St. Chariton later began the Jericho and Souka monasteries.
