Scoretable Officials Pathway

Being a scoretable official is a great way to be connected with the game of basketball. It does not require the same level of fitness or mobility that a referee or player requires but it provides an option for everyone to be involved in the game!

The scoretable is the communication point of the game – it is central to the efficient running of the game and to the experience of the players, coaches and spectators.

The role of the scoretable official is not only to assist the referees but also the coach, assistant coach and the players. Spectators also rely upon the scoretable for accurate information about the game.

The first step is to complete the Level 1 scoretable course. Being a Level 1 scoretable official enables you to perform scoretable duties on domestic competition games and Junior representative games with the opportunity to assist on Senior Representative Games with more experienced officials.

Level 0 scoretable: This level is designed to provide a foundational understanding of basic rules, scoretable positions and equipment for anyone assisting with scoretable duties.

<u>Level 1 scoretable:</u> This level is targeted at anyone needing to perform scoretable duties for their child's representative games or those wishing to become more involved. Must be at least 12 years of age. No prior basketball knowledge is required.

Assessment: On-line course completion focusing on referee signals, basic rules of the game, scoretable positions and scoring (using a scoresheet or scoring device ie IPad – depending on Association).

Practical – The official shall be observed across all 4 positions and deemed competent before being regarded as a Level 1..

<u>Level 2 scoretable:</u> This level is targeted at those who have completed the Level 1 course previously and would like to expand on the knowledge learnt and put into practice. It is expected that participants have achieved Level 1 status and have been active for at least 12 months. This course is also a minimum requirement to participate in QSL1, NBL1 and National Wheelchair Leagues.

Assessment: On-line course completiong focusing on rule knowledge and special situations.

Workshop: Interactive session encompassing game scenarios and scoresheet completion for a simulated game.

Practical – The official shall be observed on all 4 positions and deemed competent before being regarded as a Level 2. The Chairperson role may be experienced (given equipment combinations) but is not essential for Level 2 sign offs. It is expected that the practical assessments will ideally take at least 2 full seasons to obtain in all positions.

<u>Level 3 scoretable:</u> This level is targeted at those wishing to progress to WNBL and NBL and can act in all four positions on NBL1 games – although they are starting to specialise in one or two roles. It is expected that participants have been assessed as competent as a Level 2 in all positions prior to undertaking the course.

Assessment: Theory – workshop and exam with a minimum pass mark focusing on rule knowledge, location of supporting Articles and/or Interpretations and special situations.

Practical – The official shall be observed in each of the 4 positions and deemed competent before being regarded as a Level 3. The Chairperson role may be experienced (given equipment combinations) but is not essential for Level 3 sign offs.

<u>Level 4 scoretable/FIBA:</u> This level is for those who wish to participate in any International tournaments or games. It is expected that officials must be active at NBL and/or WNBL for a minimum of 5 years to be nominated.

Assessment: Online course and exam with a minimum pass mark.

Practical - Assessed as competent during a FIBA sanctioned International Tournament.
