Thank You, Lions





- Boats must not leave from landing before 1 p.m. when the signal is given.
- Boats must be back on shore at 4 p.m. (You will be disqualified if late)
- Must not get closer than 30 feet from another boat during the contest.
- Maximum of 20 Crappies to be weighed in per boat. Automatic disqualification if more than 20 crappies are brought in for weighing.
- Prize placement based on TOTAL WEIGHT of no more than 20 Crappies. In case of ties for places 1 through 4, the prize percentages will be added and then split equally.
- Prize money is based upon the number of entries minus expenses.
- Contestant will be responsible for their catch of fish.

2025-2026 Excellence Awards updates

Applications will not be necessary for the 2025-2026 award cycle. Awards will be distributed by Lions International to clubs that meet the updated criteria and eligibility requirements.

Club Excellence Award criteria

The Club Excellence Award acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs

MEMBERSHIP

- Induct a minimum of two or 20% new members, whichever is greater (not including transfer, reinstated or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the club's membership count on June 30th of the previous Lion year.
- Or sponsor a new Lions club.

SERVICE

- Report a minimum of four service activities to Lions International.
- Three of these activities must show participation in each of the three International Weeks of Service

Amplify your club's impact during Weeks of Service

This initiative unites Lions and Leos worldwide to address the critical issues of mental health and well-being, hunger, and the environment. By participating, you'll be part of three impactful weeks dedicated to creating positive change and making a difference in communities around the globe — together. So get involved and help drive collective action for a better future!

LEADERSHIP

- Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15 of the current Lion year. A minimum of 10% of the club's members complete any three courses in the Lions Learning Center.
- The club president for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.
- A minimum of two or more club officers (president, vice president, secretary or treasurer. Of which, one must be the club president) complete Club Officer Training (online with the Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator in Learn) between July 1 – December 31 of the current Lion year.

DONATIONS

Contributed to LCIF a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30th of the previous Lion year (2024-2025), multiplied by US\$20.

MINNESOTA PCA website FACTS



Climate Change: Minnesota's climate is changing, with noticeable warming and increased precipitation. The Average annual temperature has increased by 3.0 degrees F between 1895 and 2020, and annual precipitation has increased by 3.4 inches.

Minnesota is getting warmer, especially winter nights in the northern parts of the state. Daily average minimum temperatures during winter (Dec-Feb) have increased 7.3 degrees from 1895-2021 in northern Minnesota, 6 degrees in central Minnesota and 4.9 degrees in southern Minnesota. Minnesota lakes have lost an average of 10 to 14 days of ice cover in the past 50 years. Have these changes affected your Lions Clubs activities? We have conducted a few screenings since our last newsletter and cabinet meeting. The use of the machines will only increase. We need to get zone chairs as well as any other lions trained on the use of these audiometers. I expect our lions to accompany those units to the school or event that is having a screening. 








Women & Family Specialist Report



I, Lion Cheri, just returned from the International Lions Convention in Orlando Florida where I was a voting delegate for my club. There were 3 resolutions which I voted on, 3 changes for Lions around the world. Let me list them-

A resolution to authorize the association to include local taxes and fees to those clubs in which such fees and taxes apply. PASSED
A resolution to redistribute the number of International Directors by reducing the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, its affiliates, Bermuda and the Bahamas by one (1) International Director in the even years and two (2) International Directors in the odd years; Increasing South America, Central America, Mexico and Islands of the Caribbean Sea by one International director in the Even years/ and increasing India, South Asia and the Middle East by two (2) International Directors in odd years. FAILED

A resolution that will prohibit a District Governor, First Vice District Governor or Second Vice District Governor from being members of the same club. PASSED

I would like to address resolution number 2- <u>THIS IS A BIG DEAL for us!!</u> The only reason it did not pass is because the voting was done in the US and many from the US attended the convention but next year the International Convention is in Hong Kong and I can assure this well be addressed again in Hong Kong. A 2/3 majority of voting delegates is needed to pass this resolution.

Why is the US, Bermuda and Bahamas losing their International Directors? Our membership numbers have DROPPED steadily over the years. Clubs sometime voice their concern that all they hear is "Get new members! Start new clubs!" While other countries are growing the US is losing memberships. We need to quit ignoring the facts and work together as a district in increasing our clubs' memberships and help starting new clubs. Additional hands mean we can accomplish more service in your community. IF YOU know of a community who does not have a Lions Club and you think it's a possibility, please contact us, PDGs Bill & Donna Landwehr, DG Zach or our District GET team- PDG Vince & Lion Trish Thiel.

Service is tied closely to members in our clubs. It means that we can deliver more help to our community if we have the numbers to deliver these services. Each club is as unique as the community that it serves. Your Lions Club determines how to improve your community together, with more hands, more ideas and more connections. Imagine what can be accomplished! Increase your Club's strength, let the community know you care and remember to "Serve to Lead and Lead to Serve."

The 2024-2025 women membership goal was to add 15 more members than the previous year. We started with 870 women members, added 86 during the year and dropped 61 for a final total of 895 women members as of June 30, 2025. That's a plus (+) 25 from last year. Thank you for helping make our goal.




