

# MD5M want to Empower the Special Olympics Athletes at the 2026 USA Games



Since 2000, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and Special Olympics have been changing lives together. Through our "Mission: Inclusion" partnership, we've brought vision screenings, health services, and sports opportunities to athletes with intellectual disabilities in over 100 countries.

In just over a year, something extraordinary will happen in Minnesota. The 2026 Special Olympics USA Games will bring together 3,500 athletes from all 50 states for a week of competition, celebration, and pure inspiration. These athletes will compete in dozens of sports, break personal records, and show the world what determination looks like.

When they head home, we want every single one of them to take a piece of that magic with them...It is a sensory ball, known as an "all ball" or "a ball for all," originated in Europe. It is similar to balls developed after World War II for a sport called goalball, which was created for veterans blinded during the war to participate in physically challenging activities. These balls typically contain bells to make noise and are brightly colored, making them suitable for people with visual impairments. Multiple District 5M is committed to providing 3,500 of these "all balls" as gifts to the participants of the 2026 USA Special Olympics Games in Minnesota. These will be distributed during "family night" as a gesture of goodwill.

Each ball will feature the LCIF, Lions, MD5M and Leo logos. As 3,500 athletes take these balls home, it acts as a "great promotion for Lions and for our multiple," 320-248-6704 raising awareness of the organization's involvement and mission. Giving to Special Olympics through LCIF also "boosters those relationships for both of those

organizations".

Gifting the balls serves as a "goodwill effort from Lions to the participants" of the Special Olympics. It's a tangible way for the Lions to celebrate the athletes and show their support for the games.

Every Lions Club member knows the power of "We Serve." This is your chance to serve 3500 incredible athletes who will inspire everyone they meet in Minnesota.

\$25 = One ball for one athlete (like the ones in our photo) \$100 = Four balls for a team of athletes

\$500 = Twenty balls for an entire club delegation \$1,000 = Forty balls plus shipping to reach rural communities

But here's what those numbers really mean: smiles, confidence, inclusion, and the message that every athlete matters.

Please send your individual or club donations to Frank or Deb so we are able to better keep track of any donations and follow up if needed. Please note "Special Olympics" on the memo line. You still receive credit for Melvin Jones Fellowship from LCIF for your donation, you just do not receive the 15% credit back to your club or district for the Community Impact Grant.

We're addressing the importance of mental health and well-being.

Lions and Leos are promoting the importance of mental health and well-being and providing meaningful opportunities to get involved in serving this important initiative.

Our Multiple District MD5M would like all Lions Clubs to do a Mental Health and Well-being service project during October. We are providing some statistics and service ideas.

Mental health facts. Mental health is made up of a variety of factors, including our emotional, physical, psychological and social well-being.

Facts and challenges surrounding mental health:

25% increase in rates of anxiety and depression since 2020

1 in 7 youths age 10-19 experience mental health conditions, though many are unrecognized and untreated

14% of adult aged 60 plus live with a mental health disorder. Loneliness and social isolation are key risk factors

20 countries still criminalize attempted suicide and stigma and discrimination remain against those with mental health conditions world wide

# SUSTAINABLE GOALS

The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) provide a shared blueprint for peace and prosperity for people and the planet, now and into the future. The 17 goals are an urgent call for action by all countries — developed and developing — in a global partnership. Achievement of the SDGs also relies on the involvement of volunteer organizations who connect governmental strategies and initiatives with complementary, yet essential, community action.



An estimated 700,000 people die by suicide every year (World Health Organization).



On average, 2% of health budgets go to mental health (World Health Organization).



People who are exposed to adverse circumstances – including poverty, violence, disability and inequality – are at higher risk of developing a mental health condition (World Health Organization).



Depression is the leading cause of disability globally, affecting an estimated more than 300 million people worldwide – the majority of them women, young people and the elderly (United Nations).

ENSURE HEALTHY LIVES AND PROMOTE WELL-BEING FOR ALL AT ALL AGES



For depression, the gaps in service coverage are wide across all countries: in high-income countries, an estimated 23% of cases receive minimally adequate treatment for depression and in low- and lower-middle income countries this is estimated at 3% of cases (World Health Organization).



More than 80% of all people with mental disorders live in low- and middle-income countries, where the vicious cycle between mental health and poverty is particularly prevalent because of a lack of welfare safety nets and poor accessibility to effective treatment (World Health Organization).

Promote education, awareness and advocacy resources and tools from reputable organizations such as the World Health Organization and World Federation for Mental Health.



Find your region or country's suicide prevention hotline using the International. Association for Suicide Prevention's international suicide crisis hotline search feature and promote the hotline at awareness events and on social media.



Volunteer at your local center for elderly care to assist with enrichment and well-being events.



Explore the World Health Organization's mental health and well-being stigma reduction resources and promote them using social media to highlight the importance of lessening mental health stigma and debunking common misconceptions.



Use resources, facts and statistics from the World Health Organization and World Federation for Mental Health to create a World Mental Health Day social media campaign with your club, district or multiple district. Share your impact on social media with photos, videos and other assets using the hashtag #WorldMentalHealthDay.



Support Lions Quest social-emotional learning and well-being curriculum for youth in your community. Consider providing promotional support and curriculum delivery for Lions Quest by applying for a <u>Lions</u>. Quest Promotional Grant or <u>Lions Quest</u> Community Partnership Grant.



Contact local, state/province and federal government representatives to advocate for increased mental health funding and expanded services. Use our <u>Lions</u>.

Donate food, toiletries or maintenance services to a local transitional living home serving disabled individuals and/or those living with various mental health conditions in your community.



Use resources from the International Association for Suicide Prevention to highlight World Suicide Prevention Day in your community.



Explore ways to increase access to vital mental health screening services in your community among underserved groups by contacting and utilizing mental health professionals, psychologists and psychiatric physicians in your networks. Connect with local stakeholders such as schools, hospitals and community leaders to collaborate on shared goals.



Host a walk or event in partnership with a local mental health organization to raise mental health and well-being awareness utilizing the World Health Organization's mental well-being resources and depression infographics.



Provide assistance to mental health agencies and treatment centers by hosting fundraisers, providing publicity on social media and collecting needed supplies.



Encourage well-being and development of life skills among youth by creating a local social and mentorship group in your community. Get started by watching this video about Camp Conquer, a community-based youth wellness group created by Lions in Delaware, USA.

Dr. Yueh began at the Univ. of Minn. in 2007 and served the past 14years as chair of Dept. of Otolaryngology. Dr. Yueh worked closely with the Hearing Foundation on several projects over the years. We wish him good luck on his next en-

deavor. Also contained in the University newsletter was a nice write -up about the recent Lions De-Feet walk at Chanhassen in June. The U of MN. Otolaryngology dept. has participated for years. Many of them are lions.

Dodge led the Uptown Lions Club of Detroit in establishing a school to train guide dogs for people who are blind. Their motivation was Dr. Glenn Wheeler, a fellow Uptown Lion whose attempts to be accepted by another guide dog organization proved unsuccessful.

Approximately 10 million hectares of forest are lost every year. 2.) Deforestation contributes about 41 million tons of carbon dioxide a year. 3.)
