## Health and Safety

Basketball Queensland will follow all directions from the Queensland Government, Queensland Health, and local councils regarding restrictions around venue entry and capacities.

## Parking

There will be outdoor parking around Northside Indoor Sports Centre, Brisbane Entertainment Centre and Nudgee College, with additional street parking along Cambewarra Street and other streets for NISC. Parking may be limited and will be extremely busy at NISC and Nudgee College so ensure that you have leave enough time before your game. Please avoid parking illegally or blocking driveways.

## Training Courts

Court Bookings may be made for trainings and/or shoot arounds prior to tournament commencement, approximately \$60/hour at Northside and subject to availability. ## Team Entry

Each player, coach and manager must be display full association uniform to enter the stadium during the State Championships. Coaches & Managers **MUST** sign in at the ticketing desk with their entry passes.

## Scoretable Personnel

Each team competing at the Championships must supply two competent scoretable officials for each of their games. Team A is responsible for Game Clock, Team B is responsible for Courtside & Chairperson.

The responsibility will always lie with each team to ensure their games are sufficiently covered – teams will be forfeited if they fail and are unwilling to provide scoretable personnel. Refer to State Championship Rules Section 4.14.

The Host Association will be supplying **scorebench assistance** at the upcoming U12 Boys State Championships. If your team requires support, requests **must be submitted via email to [scoring@northsidewizards.com](mailto:scoring@northsidewizards.com), no later than 5:00pm Friday, 12th September 2025**. This cut-off date ensures the Host Association has adequate time to arrange rosters.

Please note the following: Once you have made and confirmed a request for assistance, please adhere to it. Requests made after the deadline are **not guaranteed**, and teams may need to organise their own scorebench personnel.

If the Host Association's Scorebench Crew determines that the allocated volunteers on scorebench are not meeting required standards, teams will be asked to provide alternative scorebench personnel, this is to ensure each game is run at the highest standard possible. We highly encourage volunteers to seek



additional experience/training in the lead up to State Champs which will help relieve pressure on the number of paid scorebench personnel being rostered for games that have requested assistance

### Scoretable for Finals

The Host association will supply **all** scoretable officials for each of the major semi finals (SF1 & SF2) and medal games in both **Divisions 1 and 2**.

In **Divisions 3 and lower**, the host association will provide **two people** for major semi finals (SF1 & SF2) and medal games, while teams **must** provide one person each to complete the bench.

### Merchandise

All 2025 State Championships official merchandise will be proudly supplied by Hoop2Hoop. Merchandise available for purchase at the event include T-shirts, Polo Shirts, Shorts, Hoodies, Socks amongst other items.

**Hoop2Hoop will be present in Northside Indoor Sports Centre for the majority of the tournament.**

### Sports Med & Strapping

BQ will provide a qualified First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic at all championship venues. During the championships, a separate room or area will be set aside for medical care.

If a player is injured during a game, the on-site First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic must fill out an injury report form. The original copy will go to the BQ Event Commissioner at the venue, and a copy will be given to the team manager upon request.

During the tournament, if a player is injured and the First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic recommends that they should not continue playing, but the player wishes to do so, the player must obtain a Doctor's Certificate stating they are fit to play. This certificate must be shown to the BQ Event Commissioner before the player can return to the court. If the injured player can't obtain a Doctor's Certificate due to insufficient time between games or if there are no open surgeries, written approval from a parent or legal guardian must be provided to the Event Commissioner (this does not apply to Concussion assessments). It is the Team Manager's responsibility to ensure that the injured player has been cleared to play by a medical professional at the request of the attending First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic.

The First Responder/Medic team will have limited access to ice during the competition. Ice will only be provided to athletes injured in games after being assessed by the attending First Responder/Medic, and only if

the First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic deems ice to be the appropriate treatment for managing the athlete's pain, not for managing existing injuries or post-game recovery. Ice is considered a treatment, and every request must be assessed and accompanied by an injury report form.



Sports taping may be provided but is entirely at the discretion of the attending First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic once a comprehensive assessment of the athlete is undertaken. Please note preventative Sports taping is not provided free of charge by the attending First Responder/Advanced First Responder/Medic.

### **Responsibilities Regarding the Draw**

Team staff are encouraged to check the draw right up to the start of the event for changes and every day during the tournament. It is the Team Manager's responsibility to ensure their team is present and ready to play at their scheduled game time.

Please ensure notifications are turned on via Basketball Connect to be aware that next round of fixtures (Eg Quarter Finals, Semi Finals, Finals) has uploaded on Basketball Connect and the BQ website. The manager is to then use this information and refer to the draw for their next game.

Please note however in the event there is any last moment changes, we will endeavour to call and then text message the Team Manager.

All results can be found online on Basketball Connect and the Basketball Queensland website.

### **Medal Presentations**

Medals presentations will occur once all medal matches during the timeslot have been decided. Medal presentation times and location is listed at the end of the Official Draw. Boys Division 1 medals and Finals MVP will be presented on court following the Gold Medal Match.

### **Official Photography**

The Official Photographer for the U12 State Championships are **HighFlyer Images**.

Team Photographs will be taken on the first and second day of the tournament with all teams being scheduled into times close to their games. Action Shots will be taken during the tournament. All team photos will be distributed digitally to participants, free of charge.

#### *Spectator and Association Photography*

Any spectators or association representatives wishing to capture content at a tournament must apply for Media Accreditation via the Basketball Queensland website. Applications are reviewed and may grant free venue access, depending on the event.



Parents capturing content of their own child for personal use do not require accreditation. However, all individuals capturing content must not sell or distribute it, or film other players without consent. All media activity must comply with Basketball Queensland's Media & Child Safety Policy.

### *Commercial Rights*

Photographers and Videographers that attend any BQ sanctioned tournament are not allowed to sell any content captured. Any persons who don't follow these rules will not be allowed to attend any further BQ sanctioned tournaments. All commercial rights for photos and videos taken at State Championships will remain with BQ.

### **State Championships Conditions of Entry**

All participants and attendees at the 2025 State Championships are bound by the Basketball Queensland Conditions of Entry, BQ Codes of Behaviour, BQ Zero Tolerance Policy, BQ COVID Safe Industry Plan; and by any other Conditions of Entry & Policies as displayed by the venue.

If at any time a person is found to be breaching a code of conduct, the Zero Tolerance Policy or any condition of entry they may be removed from the stadium by event staff and face further penalty under the Basketball Queensland Tribunal By-Law, which will be enforced by the Tournament Manager, BQ Staff and Referee Commissioner.

### **Ban of Artificial Noise Equipment**

To ensure a fair, safe, and enjoyable environment for all players, officials, and spectators, Northside Wizards Basketball has introduced a ban on the use of artificial noise generators at all competitions in their venues.

This ban applies to any items designed to create or amplify disruptive noise, including (but not limited to) pool noodles, horns, whistles, and similar devices.

The decision has been made to protect: Player concentration, Effective communication for officials, Overall safety – particularly in enclosed venues where excessive noise can cause distress.

We encourage all supporters to continue showing enthusiasm and vocal encouragement from the sidelines. However, we ask that cheering remains respectful and does not interfere with the conduct of the game.

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- The team bench personnel are the only persons permitted to sit on the team bench and remain within their team bench area. Coaches and Managers on the bench must be registered in Basketball Connect.
- Either the coach or the assistant coach, but only one of them at any given time, is permitted to remain standing during the game. They may address the players verbally during the game provided they remain within their team bench area. Only during time-outs can the coaches enter the playing area to address their team provided they are close to the team bench area.
- The manager should walk behind the team bench (where possible) when attending to player requirements.
- The coach or assistant coach may approach the score table to request a time-out
- The coach and the assistant coach may go to the scorer's table during the game to obtain statistical information only when the ball becomes dead and the game clock is stopped.
- Only the coach should talk to the referees; and always in a courteous manner and under no circumstances should they enter the playing area to do this.
- The captain may talk to the referees during intervals of play to clarify rule interpretations. When the captain leaves the playing court the coach shall inform an official the number of the player who will act as captain on the playing court.

### Disputes & Decisions

All disputes and competition decisions will be heard and decided upon by the Tournament Manager and Referee Commissioner. Their decision will be final.

Please note no disputes can be lodged over draw formats. As part of nominating for the Championship teams accept the chosen format of Basketball Queensland and acknowledge that they must play under this format with no option to challenge it.

For protests over game results to be heard the following steps must be taken:

- The captain/coach/team manager **of that team shall, no later than 5 minutes following the end of the game, inform the referees that team is protesting the result of the game.**
- The Team Manager must give confirmation of the protest in writing via email to [jnrleagues@basketballqld.net.au](mailto:jnrleagues@basketballqld.net.au) This must be made within twenty (20) minutes following the end of the game.
- An application fee of \$350.00 shall be submitted with any protest, which may be refunded if proven justified. Proof of payment must be sent for the protest to be considered.
