LSQ honours visionary biotech leader with Hall of Fame Award

Life Sciences Queensland (LSQ) has inducted the late Dr Iris Depaz into its prestigious Hall of Fame, recognising her extraordinary contributions to Queensland's biotechnology sector.

UQ wins Federal Quantum funding for melanoma detection technology

UQ is one of 14 recipients of the Australian Government's Round One Critical Technologies Challenge Program (CTCP) funding, winning almost \$416,000, in partnership with Oscilladx Pty Ltd, to develop the Terahertz Quantum Technology detecting the Invisible Melanoma.

Scoliosis management and treatment system wins 2024 QUT Excolo! pitching comp

Associate Professor Paige Little, from the School of Mechanical, Medical and Process Engineering, and her team win \$100,000 in funding from the QUT Industry Engagement Fund to

accelerate the project's next stage of development. The team's suite of innovations, myScoliosis and myScoliDoc, have been developed from over 20 years of spine research at QUT.
