Exploration update

Some residents may have seen us expand our drill sites to the historic Christina Mine (between Clonbinane Rd and Sunday Creek) where we continue to work. We've been working with residents near our drill sites to ensure we are not impacting them through additional noise suppression and regular acoustic monitoring.

We've drilled four holes to date at Christina to an average depth of 600m. The holes are currently being geologically logged and sampled in our Kilmore Shed.

Community reference group kicks off

We were pleased to recently hold our first quarterly community reference group (CRG) meeting at Clonbinane Hall.

The CRG is a new way for us to hear from residents and groups about issues important to them so that we balance the needs of our community and environment. It's comprised of residents and groups who represent Clonbinane and surrounding towns.

We're extremely grateful to the CRG's members for providing their time as well as valuable and diverse local knowledge and advice.

Since 2020 we (and Mawson Gold) have drilled and reported (ASX:TSX) 126 diamond drill holes for 55,027m. Historically, between the late 1960s to 2008 numerous companies drilled 64 drillholes for 5,559m.

Gold and antimony form in a relay of vein sets from the old Christina to Apollo mines. When observed from above, the host rock to the veins resembles the side rails of a ladder, where the vertical vein sets are the rungs of the ladder that extend from surface to depth. At Apollo and Rising Sun these individual 'rungs' have been defined from surface to 1,100 m below surface, and they are 2.5 – 3.5 wide, and 20 m to 100 m in strike.

Working closely with local and state agencies continues to be a priority for SXG. Not only do we work within council, state government and Traditional Owner guidelines, we speak regularly to these organisations to ensure they know about our activities work and how we're complying with regulations.

Rainwater tank testing program

Over 15 Clonbinane properties have taken part in our rainwater tank water testing program which began in May. The program gives residents the opportunity to understand the quality of their rainwater tanks and allows SXG to establish a baseline understanding of our surrounding environment.

We'll be conducting the next quarterly tests in August and eligible residents within 2km of our operations are welcome to join the program at any time. Contact us on the details below if you'd like to take part.

It might be obvious that we're exploring for gold – after all, it's in our name – but did you know we also find antimony associated with the gold?

Antimony is a critical mineral and plays an important role in Australia's transition to a renewable energy future. It's an essential ingredient in many products you'll find in your home including electrical cables, batteries, paint, plastics, electrical devices, solar panels and flame retardants.

Antimony occurs naturally in the environment in many parts of Victoria.
