They will then write a short research proposal outlining the problem, research objectives and their proposed research strategy; including approaches, and, as relevant, arrangements for fieldwork, development of instruments and sample. They will be guided on how to effectively collect quantitative and/or qualitative data and will learn the importance of objectivity in all methods of research. Students doing qualitative methods will be introduced to the principle of reflexivity. Before starting on this journey the student will have a fruitful discussion with a supervisior about the proposed study.
