Gather Your Documents

☐ CASAS Assessment/ Basic Skills Test

Students enrolled in a career and technical program of 450 hours or more must demonstrate specific levels of reading, language, and mathematic competency. Contact the CTE institution to schedule a test or to see if you're eligible for an exemption.

☐ Transcript

To enroll in a program, you'll need your unofficial or official transcripts from HS, proof of GED, a college diploma, or TABE results. Contact the CTE institution for more information.

☐ Residency Affidavit

Florida Residency Declaration requires two (2) documents proving state residency. For a list of documents, visit *floridashines.org/residency-for-in-state-tuition*.

☐ Time to Apply!

Visit the CTE institution's website and complete your application.
