Florida offers a variety of scholarships and grants to help you fund your education and earn a degree without debt. The **Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program** is a state-funded initiative providing merit-based financial aid to Florida high school graduates for postsecondary education.

Applying for these scholarships and grants is straightforward. This guide includes requirements and details about each scholarship and grant so you can find the right scholarship for you!

Florida Gold Seal CAPE (GSC) This scholarship is for students who earn industry certifications that can be applied to college credit. Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) This award is for students who want to pursue a vocational degree or certificate program. Instead of covering a percentage of tuition, the program pays a fixed amount per credit hour, which varies by program.
