
We have two state-of-the-art museums and an exhibition gallery

Te Kongahu Museum of Waitangi

This museum weaves together stories and taonga, bringing to life the rich and complex history of Waitangi and Aotearoa New Zealand's founding documents.

Te Kongahu presents the events leading up to, during and after the signing of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the Treaty of Waitangi, exploring the differences and relevant dialogue concerning each document, viewing all perspectives equally.

Te Rau Aroha **Museum of the Price of Citizenship**

Te Rau Aroha commemorates and acknowledges the contribution of Māori to their country's involvement in many theatres of war since 1840, sharing stories of heroism, loss and restoration. It bears witness to Article 3 of the Treaty of Waitangi's real-world impact on New Zealand's development as a nation.

This immersive and interactive museum is divided into three galleries and incorporates state-of-the-art technology to help assist in bringing its stories to life.

Ngā Taonga / Treasures of Waitangi.

Treaty House

The Treaty House, constructed in 1834, was home to James Busby, the first official British Resident in New Zealand, and his family. It has been the site of some of the most important events in the history of Aotearoa New Zealand.

Ngātokimatawhaorua

Ngātokimatawhaorua, the world's largest ceremonial waka taua, is sheltered under Te Korowai ō Maikuku (the Cloak of Maikuku) near Hobson Beach.










Flagstaff

The Waitangi flagstaff is the location where the Treaty of Waitangi was first signed on 6 February 1840. The flags that fly today are the three official flags New Zealand has had since 1834 – Te Kara, the flag of the United Tribes of New Zealand (from 1834 – present), the Union flag (from 1840 – 1902), and the flag of New Zealand (from 1902 – present).

Te Whare Runanga

Te Whare Rūnanga is an intricately carved meeting house, opened on 6 February 1940 to mark the centenary of the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi. Representing the stories and carving styles of iwi from across Aotearoa, Te Whare took six years to complete.

1 March to 24 December: 9am to 5pm

26 December to 28 February: 9am to 6pm

Waitangi Treaty Grounds is open every day, except Christmas Day.

On Waitangi Day (6 February), there is a free festival at the Treaty Grounds; all buildings are closed to the public.

Waitangi, Bay of Islands

Directions

1 Tau Henare Drive, Waitangi 0293, Bay of Islands.

Located in the heart of the Bay of Islands, just a 3-hour drive north of Auckland. From Paihia, Waitangi is a 30-minute walk along the waterfront, or a 2-minute drive.

Free shuttles between Paihia and Waitangi: 1 October to 26 April, 9:30am to 3.30pm.

Waitangi is the perfect year-round destination, not to be missed.

Waitangi Treaty Grounds is owned by a non-profit charitable trust. Therefore we rely on admission fees to cover the costs of staffing and maintaining the Grounds and heritage buildings to the high standard expected by our visitors.
