

Whether you regularly purchase wood fuel or are just looking for a one-off delivery, there are some important factors you need to consider. Before you begin, read our guide to ensure the process is as seamless as possible.



## Reheat's 6 step guide to wood fuel purchasing

1. Identify what type of fuel you need i.e. wood chip, logs or pellets.
2. Find a supplier within relatively close proximity to you to guarantee value is added to the local economy. The best way to do this is find a local supplier through the [Biomass Suppliers List](#) website using your postcode.
3. Ensure they are Woodsure or ENplus accredited to guarantee the fuels quality. This will maximize your systems efficiency. Suppliers listed on the BSL are guaranteed to source their fuels sustainably as part of the verification process.
4. Decide which is the preferred method through which you want to purchase the fuel – by energy content, per tonne, or as delivered heat.
5. Organise if you are going to collect the fuel yourself, or if you require delivery. This will impact on cost but could be more practical if you don't have a vehicle capable of transporting the volumes required.
6. Plan for where and how you will store the fuels. You might want to store the fuel in a shed or similar to protect it from the worst of the weather and keep it from absorbing moisture.
