Young Adults

It is exciting if we consider our attendance numbers. While compared to the previous years or 2 we have stayed the same at **30–40 people** a week, the scene is yet so transitional and more the half of the people currently attending have only been here for a year or less. Every week we have 3–5 newcomers and so ‘uncharted’ speaking we are a bit like a small but active valve – people come as they are and yet they go carrying a bit of the memories and values instilled. We bless and walk with whoever who comes through the threshold, and yet have no strategies, no knowledge or how they will go and touch on the different parts of society and beyond. Holy Spirit knows and leads 180 ‘graduates’ to live with purpose.

On another note, this year has been awesome in the sense we have had almost every elder visit us or scheduled to visit us before the end of the year. Usually they come and serve us in the Word and their visitations have been exciting and remarkable for us.

Baptism wise we have 3 regulars at 180 baptised this year. Plus, as many as 10 young adults baptised this year having visited us. Praise the Lord.



Prayer

Praise the Lord for the growing interest in the Service Prayer Team!

Our team has welcomed four new members this year, growing from 18 to **22 members**. We’re also excited that two more individuals are currently in the onboarding process. This steady growth is a testimony to how God is stirring hearts to serve through prayer.

We also celebrate a dedicated team of 12 members who have committed to providing weekly prayer coverage for the church and BOH. Their faithful intercession is a vital part of the spiritual foundation of our ministries, and we are grateful for their faithfulness and dedication to serving behind the scenes.

COMMUNITY GROUPS

Over the past year, spurred on by Pastor Andrew's challenge to the broader church to develop a sense of holy dissatisfaction, several community groups at The Vine banded together to continue the homeless outreach ministry started by Southside Community Group in 2019. With the help of volunteer chefs from our refugee and asylum seeker community ARISE, these community groups have faithfully served the homeless living in the Happy Valley pedestrian tunnels by distributing meals, building relationships and praying for them.

For many of the community group members with little prior experience of serving the homeless, this outreach has certainly been uncharted territory. Indeed, outreach has not always been easy with unexpected challenges in the form of medical emergencies and government mandated clean-ups. But God often calls those who are willing, and not necessarily fully prepared, to action and so with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the homeless outreach ministry continues to shine God's light and demonstrate God's love to the homeless community in our city.

This year marked the rebirth of The Justice Conference Asia as we hosted the conference for the first time in six years. Partnering with a number of churches in the city and a group of amazing NGOs, the conference brought together 600 participants from 20 different nations over 2 days of worship, discussion, learning, and dreaming around God's heart for justice.

Our theme this year was 'Re-Imagine', and at the centre of the conference was a consistent call to imagine afresh a world where the most vulnerable, marginalized and hurting are embraced, loved, and fought for. Themes of a need to reimagine power from the bottom up rather than top down, of prophetically bearing witness with those facing war and displacement, of re-thinking economic models for the most poor and vulnerable, and of bringing a greater balance to gender equality in leadership were at the forefront of conversations.

We are so grateful for the incredible army of 140 volunteers who worked tirelessly in the lead up to the conference and over the weekend. None of this would have been possible without their dedication, passion and love. Thank you to everyone who helped or attended – we are so grateful for what the spirit did amongst us. And we can't wait for JCA 2027!

BOH Sunday 2025, themed “Journey: From Struggle to Hope,” aimed to provide spiritual nourishment while raising awareness and funds for Branches of Hope (BOH). The event featured a sermon by Tafadzwa (Taz) Moyo, Vine Elder and BOH Board member, focusing on the call to love our neighbours through the lens of agape love, as outlined in Matthew 22:37-40. This was complemented by testimonies and shared experiences highlighting the challenges faced by asylum seekers and refugees.

The congregation was invited to engage emotionally through a four-minute audio journey, immersing them in the realities faced by those that BOH serves. Following this, Alexander Pforte, BOH Executive Director, led a collective exercise to emphasize the arduous journey from struggle to hope, encouraging attendees to consider their role in offering support.

The day culminated in a call to action, inviting the community to contribute to the STAR programme, which provides vital assistance to those in need. With opportunities to become monthly donors and volunteers, the service fostered a connection between the congregation and the client community. Once again, everyone at BOH was blown away by the response, with around HK\$1.5 million raised in support of its services!

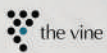

It was an encouragement to us all to know God is always ahead of us.

FINANCE

On behalf of the staff and leadership of the Vine, we thank all of you who have given generously and faithfully to the church last year. Your contribution made a difference. First, by funding the work of the church. Second, by being a constant source of encouragement.

In 2025 we acknowledged that we were entering a period of being in the uncharted. We embraced not having all the answers, or a clear picture of what the future held, but knowing that God was inviting us into an adventure of discovery with him. On Vision Sunday we shifted our focus from immediate financial giving, to preparing ourselves so that we could respond fully and, if called, radically to the Holy Spirit *at the appropriate time*.

Our full year church income for Wan Chai was \$45.3M, which is approximately \$10 million less than in 2024. Much of this shortfall is accounted for by our decision not to make a call for immediate financial giving on Vision Sunday, for which we received \$12.5M in 2024. However, it is important to note we have also seen an increase in congregation size of 7% and so might have expected that to increase our income. We are therefore growing numerically but not yet seeing an equivalent growth in tithing.

During this year, our expenses amounted to \$45.4M including our tithing of approximately \$6 million to external mission and ministry partners. This was a modest, 4.3% increase from 2024. Therefore, primarily due to the reduction in giving, our income was \$86 thousand less than our expenses. This resulted in a 0.18% reduction in our total financial reserves.

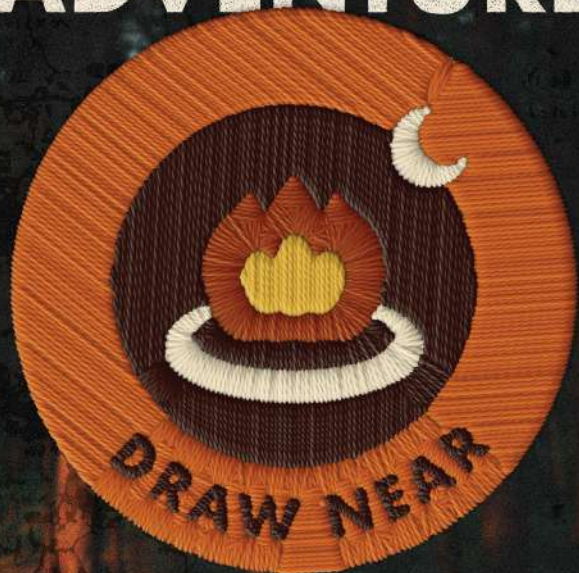
For Yuen Long, our full year church income was \$3.9M. This is approximately \$1 million more than in 2024. The increased income is encouraging sign of the church growing and becoming more established as it moves towards self-sufficiency.

Total expenses for Yuen Long were \$5.9M resulting in a little over \$2M deficit. This is 5% more than last year. As in previous years this deficit is covered by Wan Chai.

As a church both in Yuen Long and Wan Chai we are, and always have been, solely dependent on God. For finances God has almost entirely provided for us through the generous giving of our congregation. We humbly ask those who are wondering how to contribute to the church to consider doing so financially, ideally through a regular tithe. As our vision and ambition expands, including through planting new churches, we do not doubt that we can depend on God. Our prayer is that when God calls us to act boldly we will be prepared to do so, in our actions and in our giving.

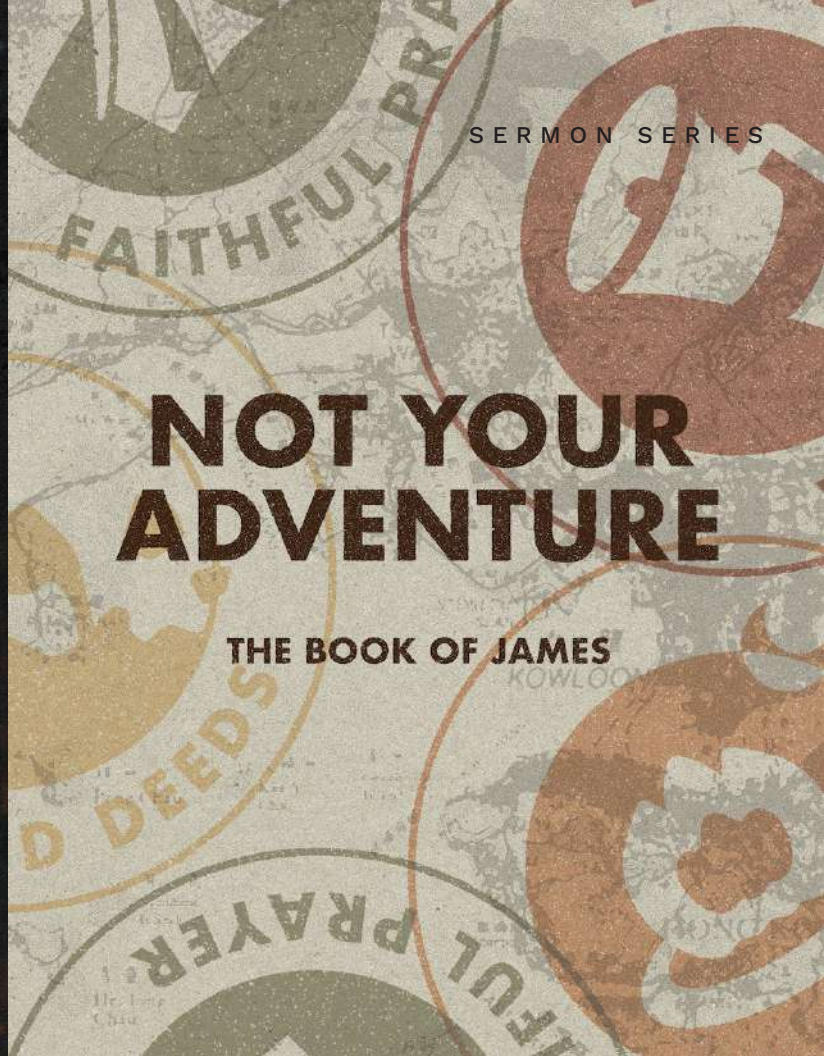

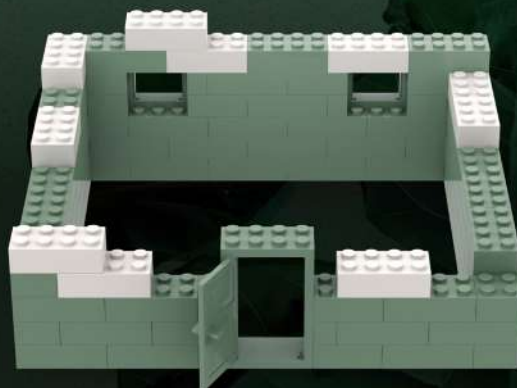

Hosted an **audience of 150 people** – both Deaf and hearing – at The Vine for the Hong Kong premier of the first sign language Jesus film, Jesus: Deaf Missions Film, this is the first of its kind produced and acted by the deaf as a gospel expression.



Mobilized **47 passionate volunteers** from the Vine missions, ARISE outreach teams and staff members, who regularly bring hope and companionship to detention centers, elderly homes, hospitals, and asylum seeker households.



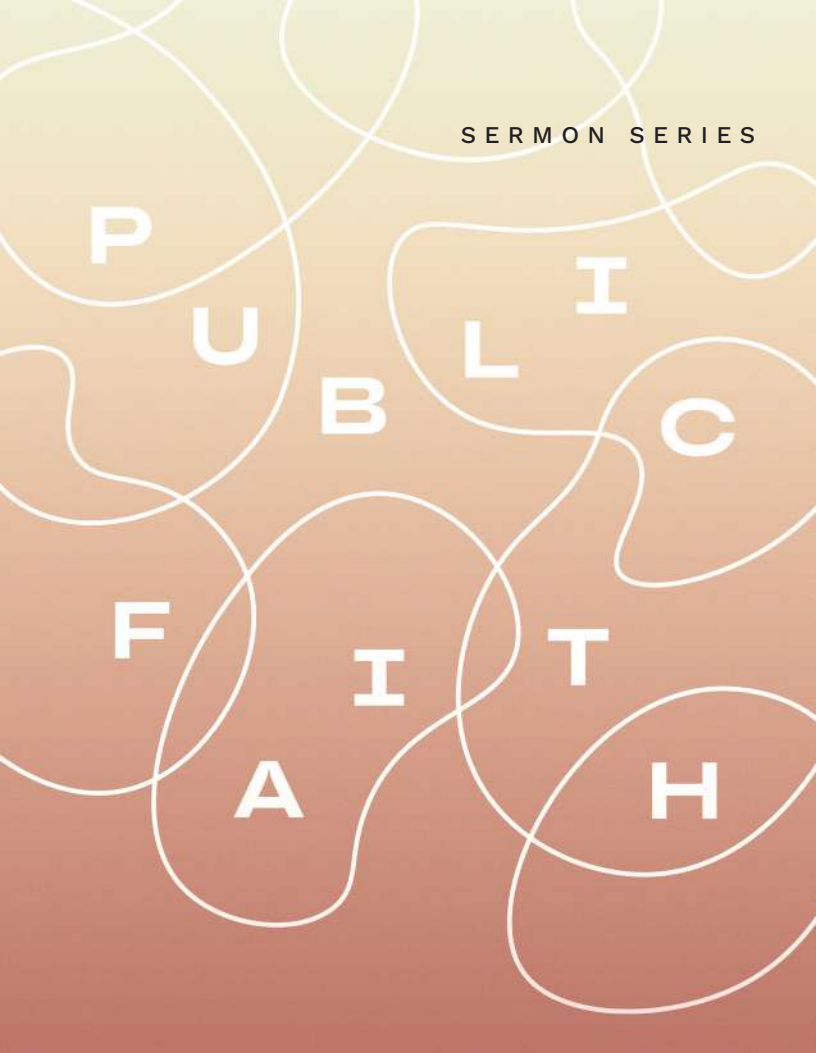
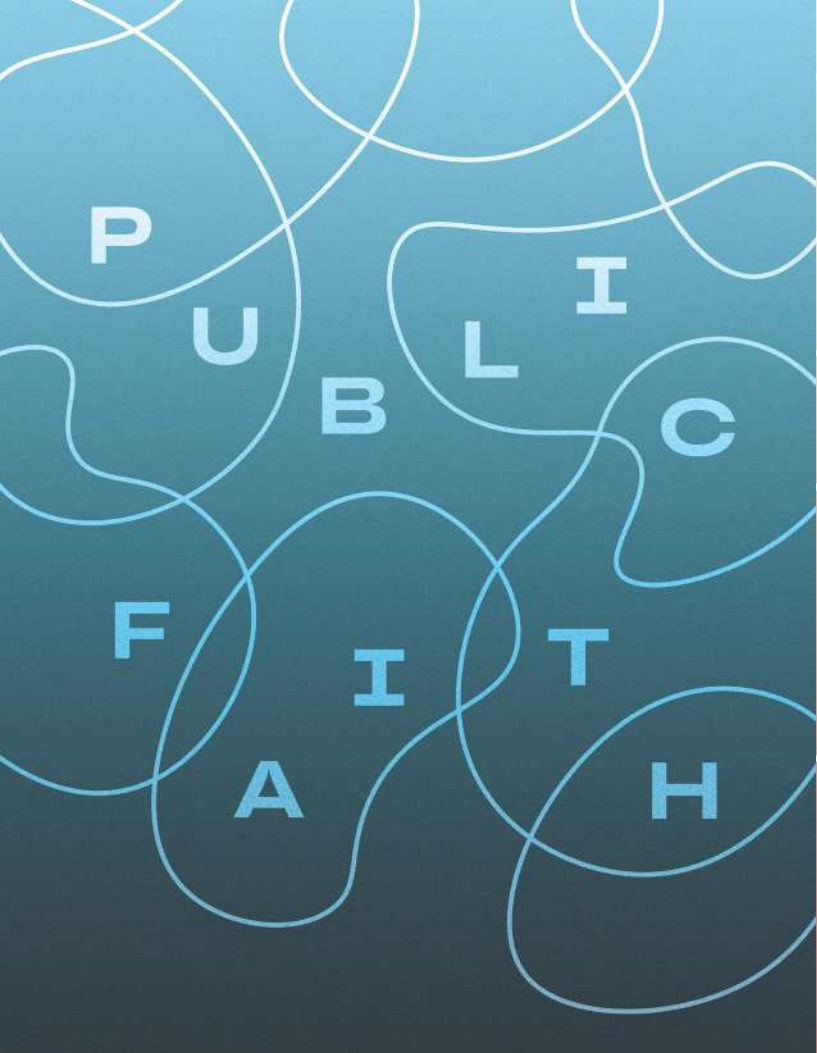

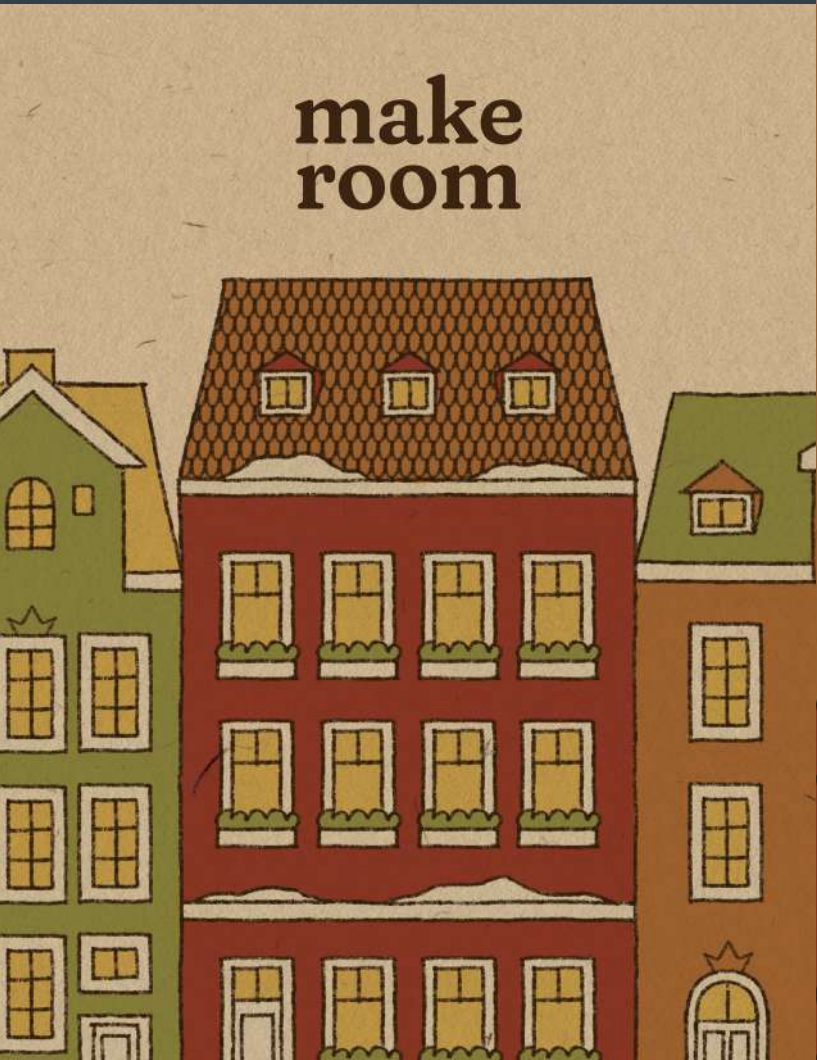
