Why Pyjamas?

It may seem like a small thing, a brandnew pair of winter pyjamas – but for many children receiving a pair means so much more than just staying warm.

For some, it's the first brand new item of clothing they've ever owned. It can mean a better sleep, fewer winter illnesses, and a sense of comfort during the coldest months.

For parents and caregivers, it's one less thing to worry about especially when finances are stretched and the cost of living keeps climbing, knowing their child will be warm at night can bring real relief.

With one in three children living in hardship in New Zealand, this simple gift makes a real difference!

"The PJs received have made a truly positive impact on children with health needs whose families are facing financial hardship. For many, these were something they simply could not have afforded otherwise."

One parent recently shared: "we were going through a really tough time, and when we received pyjamas for the whole family, I honestly cried. It wasn't just the warmth of the clothes - it was the kindness behind them. It meant more than we can say".

Once again, our community rallied together to make a real difference in The PJ Project's fifth year. From donating and collecting, to packing and delivering, thousands of people supported in countless ways.

This year was our biggest year yet! Thanks to our partnership with The Warehouse Group, PJ collection bins were placed in stores across the country, donations could be made at checkout and online, giving customers the opportunity to be part of the campaign, working together to keep kids in need warm over winter.

Schools, businesses, volunteers, community partners and donors all played a vital role in delivering the magic. We are incredibly grateful to everyone who helped make it happen.

Together, we delivered 28,173 pairs of warm, winter pyjamas to children across 81 towns and cities, wrapping children in warmth, care and kindness.




HIGHLIGHTS OF 2025

With this year's success, we're already eyeing 2026 – stay tuned!

















IN THE MEDIA
