Employment prospects are broad and growing, with roles such as Land Surveyor, Environment Officer, GIS Officer, Environmental Consultant, Urban Planner, Transport Planner and many more.

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COURSE CONTENT & ASSESSMENT

AQA's A Level in Geography has been designed to excite students' minds, challenge perceptions and stimulate students' investigative and analytical skills. The course is split into three physical and three human topics, however within these are many cross-topic connections. As part of the A Level course you will carry out fieldwork to collect data for your NEA (Non-Examination Assessment), which makes up 20% of your overall grade.

Throughout the qualification you will study six components. The topics we cover at Brigshaw are:

- Water and carbon
- Hazards
- Coastal systems and landscapes
- Changing places
- Global systems and global governance
- Contemporary urban environments
