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COURSE CONTENT & ASSESSMENT

Component 1: Personal investigation (96 marks, 60% of A Level)

You will undertake a practical investigation into an idea, theme or issue. This practical material is supported by a written essay. The focus of the investigation will be identified independently by you and will lead to a final body of work for your exhibition. The investigation will demonstrate your ability to develop and visually explore your theme and showcase your practical skills.

Component 2: Externally set assignment Preparatory period + 15 hours supervised time (96 Marks, 40% of A level)

You will be provided with an externally set question paper in February. There will be a choice of 8 questions or themes, from which you choose one as a starting point for your project. This project will culminate in 15 hours of supervised time under exam conditions where you will produce a final piece(s) for your project
