SEL & Mental Health Initiative

Grant Overview

The Supporting Students' Social Emotional Learning, Behavioral & Mental Health, and Wellness (SEL & Mental Health) Competitive Grant provides Massachusetts public school districts, charter schools, and educational collaboratives with funding to expand and strengthen multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) that address students' social, emotional, behavioral, and mental health needs. This grant supports culturally responsive SEL practices, evidence-based interventions, and sustainable partnerships with community-based providers to create comprehensive systems of care.

Rethinking Discipline Initiative

Grant Overview

The Rethinking Discipline Initiative competitive grant provides Massachusetts districts and schools with funding to reduce exclusionary discipline practices and strengthen equitable, supportive school environments. This grant supports the development and implementation of action plans that promote positive school climate, foster student belonging, and reduce disparities in discipline outcomes.

Eligibility

- Districts identified in previous Cohorts
- Districts with a need index of 80+ AND that have disproportionate suspension rates

2 Key Priorities Sown To Grow Alignment

Priority 1

Create a school climate & culture that embodies an equitable, safe, positive, healthy, culturally -sustaining, & inclusive whole-school learning **environment** for all students; & which supports students' academic & social emotional wellbeing.

- ✓ **Inclusive Design** Developed by a diverse team with expertise in culturally responsive, inclusive practices.
- ✓ Sense of Belonging Focus K-12 lessons where students co-create norms that celebrate differences & value all voices. Collaborative lessons build skills in respect, empathy, & constructive conflict resolution.
- ✓ Personalized Support Weekly Tier 1 student reflections paired with teacher responses ensure every learner is heard and supported. These touchpoints foster connection and lay the groundwork for a supportive classroom environment.

Priority 2

Reduce suspensions & expulsions for all students, & disparate use of exclusionary practices seen frequently for students with disabilities & students by race/ethnicity

- Proactive Intervention Through weekly reflections, educators gain timely visibility into student needs, allowing interventions before challenges escalate into more serious behavioral concerns. This reduces reliance on exclusionary discipline practices.
- ✓ **Student Voice-Driven Data** Reflection data gives schools insight into the "why" behind student behaviors. Leaders can review this information when considering disciplinary actions to understand student circumstances, address root causes, & ensure decisions are guided by student experiences rather than adult assumptions.





Safe & Supportive Schools

Grant Overview

The Safe and Supportive Schools Competitive Grant provides Massachusetts public schools with funding to organize, integrate, and sustain school- & district-wide efforts aimed at creating safe and supportive school environments. The grant includes both planning and implementation funding, enabling schools to first assess needs and develop action plans using the Safe and Supportive Schools (SaSS) Framework, and then implement strategies that foster positive school climates & promote student well-being.





1 year with option for 1 year continuation grant

Eligibility

All public school districts. Priority is given to schools eligible for the Rethinking Discipline Initiative.

Weekly Emotional Check-In & Reflection



Sown to Grow's approach centers on a core practice of student reflection and teacher response. This weekly routine builds trust, strengthens connections, and cultivates a school environment where students feel a genuine **sense of belonging.** Data dashboards allow students, teachers, and administrators to track emotions and experiences over time, guiding **data-driven decisions that elevate student voice** and ensure support is timely, meaningful, and personalized.

SEL Curriculum



Sown to Grow offers a differentiated K-12 curriculum and assessment platform fully aligned with CASEL competencies, which are supported by the State of Massachusetts. The curriculum also includes a unit on Sense of Belonging to foster equity and inclusion. Pre- and post-assessments track student growth over time and generate valuable data insights that can inform needs assessments. MTSS



Massachusetts' MTSS framework emphasizes SEL as an essential foundation for effective support. Sown To Grow directly supports this model by elevating student voice through reflections and check-ins, while providing educators with real-time SEL insights. This strengthens Tier 1 practices, flags students needing additional support, and drives equitable, data-informed decisions across all tiers.

Using Tier 2 Lessons



Use the STG to help inform the creation of small groups.



Provide targeted support for your students.



Build a stronger sense of connection & wellbeing in small groups.

Sown To Grow's technology analyzes student input to identify those who may need Tier 2 support, based on themes such as social anxiety, academic stress, persistent sadness or grief, external challenges, or low sense of belonging. The platform then provides Tier 2 extension activities that support **restorative practices** and **targeted skill-building** based on individual needs. All lessons and activities are grade-level differentiated, **CASEL-aligned**, and developed in partnership with licensed school social workers and practitioners.

Research & Impact



Sown To Grow has deep support from research organizations that have funded and vetted the company's approach, pedagogy, and technology. Our work is funded by the U.S. Department of Education, the National Science Foundation, Digital Promise, and New Schools Venture Fund. Independent researchers at Stanford, UCLA, UC Berkeley, WestEd, and LeanLab Education have conducted research that validates the feasibility and positive impact of our program on student relationships, attendance, school culture, and academic outcomes.
