Conditions Of Carriage

Notice: If the passenger's journey involves an ultimate destination or stops in a country other than the country of departure, the provisions of the Warsaw Convention may be applicable. The Convention governs and, in most cases, limits the liability of operators for death and personal injury and the loss or damage of baggage.

- The passenger ticket is a contract between the passenger (the ticket holder) and the licensed air service operator, Maverick Air Charters (the holder of a valid Air Service License) issued in terms of the provisions of the Air Services Act, 1990 (Act 115 of 1990).
- The passenger ticket is an undertaking by the operator, referred to above, to carry the passenger and his/her baggage on the route described in the said ticket or an alternative route as mutually agreed upon by the two parties.
- The operator warrants that it is insured in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Domestic Air Services Regulations, 1991, as amended.
- The operator, its servants, agents and representatives shall be under no liability for any damage of any kind in excess of the limitations imposed in the aforesaid regulations, whether caused or occasioned during the carriage of the passenger by air or in connection with the auxiliary services incidental to the carriage by air or whether or not caused or occasioned by the act, omission, neglect, gross neglect or omission or default of the operators servants or agents.
- The passenger hereby indemnifies the operator against any claim or claims for compensation for damage, loss or injury whether sustained on board the aircraft or in the course of the flight, embarking or disembarking, caused directly or indirectly to his/her belongings which indemnity shall extend to the passenger's dependants, estate or any person whomsoever.
- The operator indemnifies the passenger against any damage which the operator and its servants or agents may suffer through any act or omission of the passenger, howsoever caused.
- 7. The ticket shall be valid only for the date specified therein, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the operator.
- The operator undertakes to use its best efforts to carry the passenger and its baggage with reasonable dispatch.
- The operator reserves the right to refuse any carriage to any person who has acquired a ticket in violation of the operator's tariffs, rules and regulations.
- 10. The conditions of carriage may not be altered, modified, amended or any provision be waived by any servant, agent or representative of the operator.

Dangerous goods include many common items from the home, or workplace, which, because of their physical or chemical properties, have potential to endanger the safety of your flight. The following is a list of prohibited goods. It is not all inclusive. Many other dangerous goods are also prohibited. When in doubt, please check.

- Flammable liquids or solids: Fuel, paints, lighter refills, matches.
- Fireworks: Signal flares, sparklers or other explosives.
- Household items: Drain cleaners and solvents.
- Pressurized containers: Spray cans, butane fuel, scuba tanks if pressurized, propane tanks, C02 cartridges.
- Weapons: Loaded firearms, loose ammunition, gunpowder, mace, tear gas and other irritants.
- Other hazardous materials: Dry ice, gasoline-powered tools, wet-cell batteries (as used in cars), camping equipment with fuel, radioactive materials (except in limited quantities), poisons, infectious substances.

Violators of Dangerous Goods Civil Aviation Regulations (CAR92.00.1-28) may be subject to a civil penalty of up to R50,000 for each violation and in appropriate cases, a criminal penalty.

DANGEROUS ARTICLES AND BAGGAGE For safety reasons the dangerous articles listed below may not be carried in passengers' baggage.


COMPRESSED GASES Compressed gases - (deeply refrigerated, flammable, notflammable and poisonous) such as butane, oxygen, liquid nitrogen, aqualung cylinders, compressed gas cylinders FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS Flammable liquids and solids such

as lighter fuel, MATCHES, paints,

thinners, fire-lighters.











Explosive ammunitions. fireworks and flares.



EXPLOSIVES



OXIDISING MATERIALS

Oxidising materials such as bleaching powder, peroxides





Radioactive materials, Briefcases and attaché cases with installed alarm devices.







Poisons and infectious substances such as insecticides, weed-killers and live virus materials.

Other dangerous articles such as magnetised, offensive or irritating materials

Note: Disabling devices such as mace, pepper spray etc, containing an irritant or incapacitating substance are prohibited.

Medicines and toiletries in limited quantities which are necessary or appropriate for the passenger during the journey such as hairsprays, perfumes and medicines containing alcohol may be carried. Many of these listed articles can be carried as air cargo provided they are packed in accordance with cargo regulations. Use of cellular telephones is not permitted on board.
