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access to Retention Coaching, offered for four to six months after their initial return. This use of personalized coaching helps students overcome barriers in order to re-enter their programs, all while ensuring they have the support they need to persist and complete.

THE IMPACT

So what's the result of this statewide effort? A total of 2,896 learners have successfully re-enrolled as of Fall 2025.

While the re-enrollment results have proven favorable, the initiative has also seen promising persistence and completion outcomes. According to [a recent report from the Belk Center for Community College Leadership and Research](#), thus far, 28% of NC Reconnect learners have earned a degree or credential after returning to college, and 17% of the graduates earned a degree or credential within the first year back. What's more, 67% of NC Reconnect learners in continuing education programs have earned a passing grade. NC Reconnect doesn't just prioritize re-enrollment — the initiative is working to ensure that students have what they need to persist and graduate.


