NORTH SHERMAN BOULEVARD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

North Sherman Boulevard is classified as a principal arterial roadway with a posted speed limit of 30 miles per hour. The existing average annual daily traffic is approximately 17,400 to 24,400 vehicles per day.

The current typical section is a four-lane divided roadway with parking lanes, median, grass terraces, and concrete sidewalk. The roadway is concrete from North Avenue to Center Street and Burleigh Street to Capitol Drive. There is asphalt over concrete base from Center Street to Burleigh Street.




Potential Improvements

- Enhanced bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.
- Storm sewer lateral replacement.
- Street lighting replacement.
- Traffic signal replacement at the intersections of Sherman Boulevard and North Avenue, Wright Street, Center Street, Locust Street, Burleigh Street, Townsend Street, and Roosevelt Drive.
- The project is within the North Sherman Boulevard Historic District. A key factor during the redesign is preserving the historical atmosphere of the corridor.

Roadway alternatives will be developed based on public input!

Sherman Boulevard Project Limits



Construction on the North Sherman Boulevard Project is tentatively scheduled to begin in 2026 and carry into 2027-2028.
