


#### **Foundation News**







#### **Photo Exhibit Features the Work of Jim Gates**

#### The Golden Gallery

The Golden Gallery will feature photographs taken and printed by late resident Jim Gates, who lived at Spring Harbor from 2006-2024. Jim had a long love of photography, beginning as a pre-teen when he had a dark-room at home. When he and his wife, Sally, moved here, Jim set up a digital scanner and Epson SureColor P800 printer, which along with new techniques in Photoshop, allowed him to become a master printer in his apartment. In the 2010s, he and his good friend Dr. Bill Edwards became photography partners, going on photo shoots to learn the new technology of digital cameras such as drones; the Gigapan process for panoramas, as well as Osmos equipment. Bill Edwards organized this exhibit to illustrate Jim's mastery of the art of printing. It will hang in July and August. Please take time and stroll down our Art Gallery hallway, located on the 3rd floor, just past Dr. Jamal's office.




