we're building a workplace where nurses thrive and where patients receive the highest quality care.

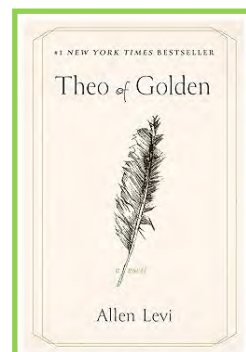
