Piedmont Columbus Midtown ICU Project Now Complete

Piedmont Columbus Regional Midtown has completed a \$58 million expansion and renovation project to increase its critical care capacity with 43 new ICU beds and 68 renovated rooms across three nursing units. Hospital leaders, board members and community supporters cut the ribbon on the 99,038 square foot project where the newly named Shelby and Wanda Amos Intensive Care Unit was revealed. Wanda made a generous contribution to the Piedmont Columbus Foundation in memory of her late husband, Shelby, the son of Aflac Principal Founder John Amos. “Shelby received care in the old Piedmont Columbus Midtown ICU in 2020, and the staff were always so kind-hearted and compassionate to us,” said philanthropist **Wanda Amos**. “He may not have said much, but Shelby’s loyalty, kindness and love for his community always spoke for itself. He would be incredibly proud of this day as the ICU team continues to care for other families in their greatest time of need.” The Piedmont Columbus Midtown facility has been in place since 1983. This was a much-needed project to expand Piedmont’s ability to provide the best patient-centered care. “We are blessed to have a dedicated team of critical care doctors, nurses, technicians, respiratory therapists and many other staff members that work around the clock to provide compassionate, high-quality care to our most critical patients,” said Piedmont Columbus Regional CEO **Scott Hill**. “The new ICU rooms are 2 1/2 times larger than before. Our ICU team is now in a central location with the needed space, the latest technological capabilities and the expertise to provide patient-centered, life-saving care as we meet the ongoing health needs of our community.”

Wellness Ambassador of the Month ~ WAM!

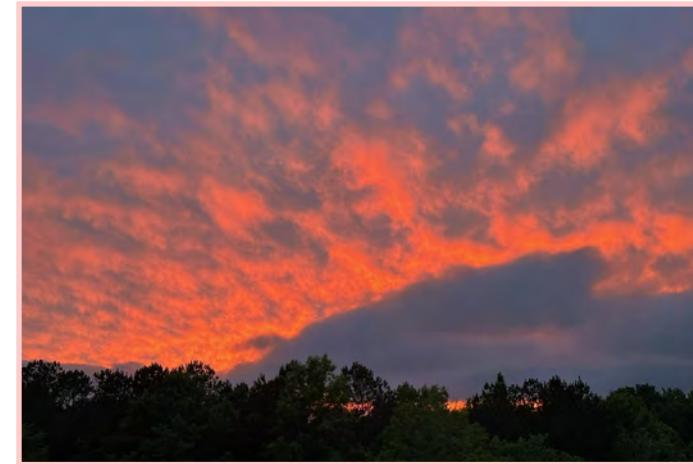

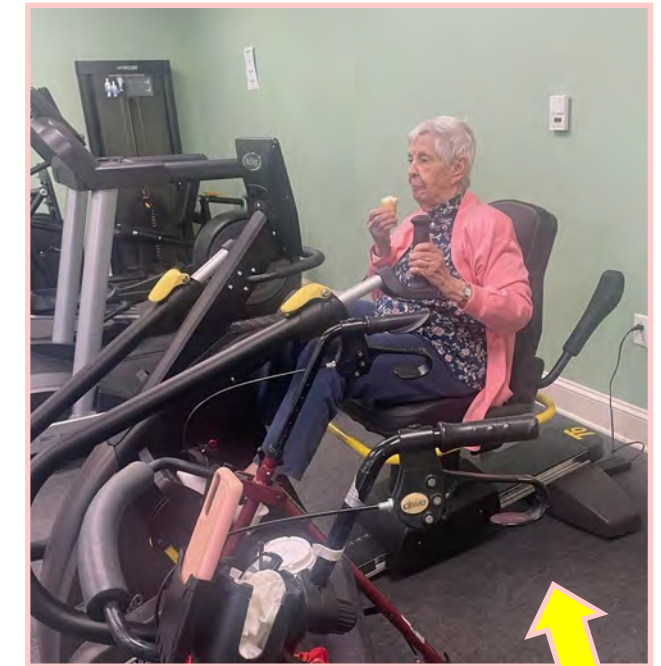

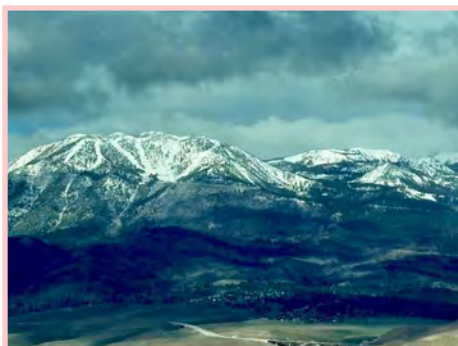


Story by Pat Haney: At Jeannie Robinsons 102 birthday celebration, I told the crowd about a story from 2013 when Ms. Jeannie called me to ask me to come see the hummingbird nest on her balcony! Long story short: the mama hummingbird had 2 babies in the nest (the nest was about the size as a small egg and they make the nests from lichens, moss, spider silk and tree sap). A few weeks later we found the mama bird had suddenly died and the babies were alone. Being the animal lover that I am, I got a ladder and climbed up to the nest and rescued those tiny little birds! I actually was able to locate a “hummingbird lady” in Columbus that specializes in raising baby hummingbirds! She told me to give them cranberry juice until she could come and get them the next day. She was nice enough to keep in touch with me and she was able to raise those babies into full grown hummers that she eventually released from her home. She told me that most of the hummers she raises, stay close to her home and visit her often. *There were many residents at Jeannie’s birthday party who asked me to re-print the photos of this wonderful story, so here they are for you to enjoy!*

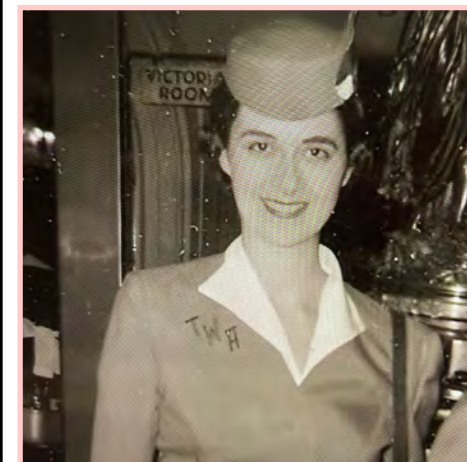

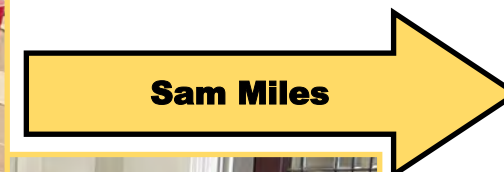

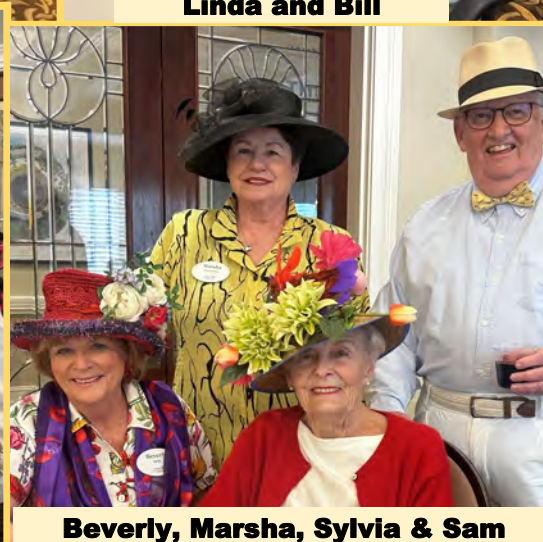
