1 Cor 13:8-10

Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away.

15

1 Cor 13:11-13

When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known. And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Acts 2:4,6

...they were all filled with the Holy
Spirit and began to speak with other
tongues, as the Spirit gave them
utterance.... everyone heard them
speak in his own language.

Eph 4:11

And He Himself gave some to be
apostles, some prophets, some
evangelists, and some pastors and
teachers,

1 Cor 14:5

...he who prophesies is greater
than he who speaks with tongues,
unless indeed he interprets, that
the church may receive
edification.

1 Cor 14:5

...he who prophesies speaks
edification and exhortation and
comfort to men. He who speaks
in a tongue edifies himself, but he
who prophesies edifies the church

1 Cor 12:28-30

And God has appointed these in the church:
first apostles, second prophets, third teachers,
after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps,
administrations, varieties of tongues. Are all
apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Are
all workers of miracles? Do all have gifts of
healings? Do all speak with tongues? Do all
interpret?

Lk 11:9-13


