Paul...seeing that he had faith to be healed, said with a loud voice, "Stand up straight on your feet!" And he leaped and walked...the people [said] "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!"....Then the priest of Zeus...brought oxen...intending to sacrifice with the multitudes.

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Acts 14:8-20

Then Jews from Antioch and Iconium came there; and having persuaded the multitudes, they stoned Paul and dragged him out of the city, supposing him to be dead. However, when the disciples gathered around him, he rose up and went into the city. And the next day he departed with Barnabas to Derbe.

Gal 5:4

You have become estranged from Christ, you who attempt to be justified by law; you have fallen from grace.

Justification is
being judged/declared righteous
Sanctification is
being changed/made holy

Legalism is justification/sanctification depends upon your own efforts

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Gal 1:11-12

But I make known to you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ.

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JN 14:25-26

These things I have spoken to you while being present with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

Gal 2:14

But when I saw that they were not straightforward about the truth of the gospel, I said to Peter before them all, "If you, being a Jew, live in the manner of Gentiles and not as the Jews, why do you compel Gentiles to live as Jews?"

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Gal 2:20

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Gal 2:21

I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

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Romans 7:1-4

Or do you not know, brethren (for I speak to those who know the law), that the law has dominion over a man as long as he lives?

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Romans 7:1-4

For the woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives. But if the husband dies, she is released from the law of her husband.

Romans 7:1-4

So then if, while her husband lives, she marries another man, she will be called an adulteress; but if her husband dies, she is free from that law, so that she is no adulteress, though she has married another man.

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Romans 7:1-4

Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God.



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Gal 2:19-20

For I through the law **died to the law** that I might **live to God**. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.

Col 2:6

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,

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Gal 3:1

O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified? Gal 3:2

This only I want to learn from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?

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Gal 3:3

Are you so foolish? Having begun in the Spirit, are you now being made perfect by the flesh?

Is 64:6

And **all our righteousnesses** are like filthy rags

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Gal 3:4

Have you suffered so many things in vain—if indeed it was in vain?

Gal 3:5

Therefore **He who supplies** the Spirit to you **and works miracles** among you, does He do it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?—

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Gal 3:6

just as Abraham "believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness."

[quoting Gen 15:6]

Gal 3:7

Therefore know that only those who are of faith are sons of Abraham.

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Rom 2:28-29

For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly; neither is that circumcision, which is outward in the flesh: But he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise is not of men, but of God.

Gal 3:8

And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel to Abraham beforehand, saying, "In you all the nations shall be blessed."

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Gal 3:9

So then those who are of faith are blessed with believing Abraham.

Gal 3:10

For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who does not continue in all things which are written in the book of the law, to do them."

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Rom 6:23

For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
