Academic line/rank will be determined by qualifications and experience of the successful candidate. The major criteria for academic appointment of Clinician Educators (CE) is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, teaching, administrative and/or scholarship appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fill. The successful applicant should be eligible for a California Medical License.

The expected base pay range for this position is: \$310,000 - \$350,000
