BIO-458HN (4 credits)

Honors Genetics

Class Section: TR300A

This writing intensive course provides a contemporary examination of the principles of heredity and variation, including Mendelian, molecular and population genetics. Students explore topics such as gene mapping, DNA structure and repetition, population genetics and molecular change.

Prerequisites: BIO-181 and BIO-181L

COM-211HN (4 credits)

Honors Public Speaking

Class Section: WF1100A

This basic course in oral communication uses focused content to practice the principles of effective oral presentation. The lectures, speaking assignments and all written work will acquaint the student with the history, theory, practice and necessary technological literacy required for effective message building and presentation.

HON-320 (2 credits)

College to Career Momentum

Class Section: W100A

Students will further explore five approaches to leadership, develop their individual leadership philosophy and learn about the important mindset shifts from student to young professional. Students will create their career plan, work on building their resilience in the face of challenges and get introduced to lesser-known career and professional environment navigation skills.

HON-355 (2 credits/8-week course)

Academic Journal Writing

Class Section: M100A

This course integrates individual coaching with an interactive workshop style environment. Writing guides will be provided and the teaching faculty will aid students through the writing and publication processes. The goal will be to submit the manuscript to the Canyon Journal of Undergraduate Research (CJUR) for possible publication.

Prerequisites: Completion of English 105 and 106 (or equivalent) and acceptance into the Honors College

HTH-352HN (4 credits)

Honors Survey of Historical Theology

Class Section: TR900A

This honors-specific course surveys the major developments within the history of Christianity that have shaped Christian doctrine. Emphasis is placed on key events, personalities, theological developments and movements.

Prerequisites: HTH-201 and HTH-202

MGT-422HN (4 credits)

Honors for Organizational Behavior and Management

Class Section: TR100A

Drawing upon practical management situations, this course is a study of individual and group behavior in organizations through detailed coverage of the functions of management, individual differences/diversity, leadership, motivation, decision-making, organizational design and organizational change and development. Emphasis is placed on how an understanding of organizational behavior leads to effective management practice.
