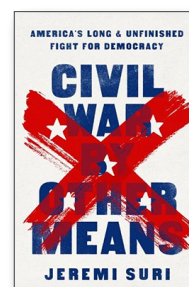
## Biography

Jeremi Suri is one of the nation's leading voices on democracy, leadership, and global affairs. He holds the Mack Brown Distinguished Chair for Leadership in Global Affairs at the University of Texas at Austin, where he is a professor in the Department of History and the LBJ School of Public Affairs.

Suri is the author and editor of eleven acclaimed books on American politics and foreign policy. His influential works—*Civil War By Other Means*, *The Impossible Presidency*, *Liberty's Surest Guardian*, *Henry Kissinger and the American Century*, and *Power and Protest*—provide an exciting new take on the evolution of leadership, governance, and global power.

Suri is also the host of the weekly podcast *This is Democracy* and author of the daily newsletter *Democracy of Hope*, where he continues to explore the ideas, values, and leadership needed to sustain democratic societies.
