



**RULES AND PROCEDURES GOVERNING PRIZEPICKS' 2025
MLB SEASON AND PLAYOFFS REBOOT PROMOTION**

PrizePicks hereby adopts these Rules and Procedures ("Rules"), on March 19, 2025.

A. Summary

The PrizePicks 2025 MLB Season and Playoffs Reboot Promotion (the "Promotion") will be conducted to support PrizePicks' offerings during the 2025 MLB season, including the MLB Playoffs 2025 (but excludes (i) the 2025 MLB All-Star Game and any other events associated with the 2025 MLB All-Star Game, such as the Home Run Derby, and (ii) any spring training games (including those that take place after the beginning of the regular season)). The Promotion will "reboot" a qualifying entry by reverting the entry down to the next viable entry level, i.e. a 6 Pick Flex entry will revert down to a 5 Pick Flex entry if one of the squares in the entry is eligible for the Promotion.

B. Promotion Period

The Promotion will begin on March 27, 2025 and end after the conclusion of the 2025 World Series.

C. Eligibility

To be eligible for the Promotion, entrants must:

- Be physically located in an Eligible Jurisdiction.
- Otherwise be eligible to enter PrizePicks contests as described in the PrizePicks Terms of Service.
- Make a "More" play on a square offering a single-game full-game batting statistic for a single MLB player or combination of MLB players (e.g., "Aaron Judge 1.5 RBIs in Game X" but not "Ronald Acuña average 2 hits per game" or "Spencer Strider 8.5 strikeouts in

Game X") ("Eligible Square") in an entry during the Promotion Period. Eligible Squares also include any square with combinations of players from the MLB and different leagues, so long as each league that the players in this square play in has a reboot policy and all players included in the square meet their respective leagues' reboot requirements.

The following types of squares are not Eligible Squares:

1. Squares that are offering any pitching statistic, including for players listed as two-way players on his team's roster on MLB.com (e.g., Shohei Ohtani), even if that player also bats in the same game.
2. Squares that are MLB 1st inning, other partial game MLB markets or any other non-MLB sports.
3. Squares for MLBSZN (full MLB season) or partial MLB season-long stat categories.
4. Squares that include combinations of (i) at least one MLB player and (ii) any players (unless those players are also covered by a reboot policy in their respective leagues) from other sports.
5. Squares that are picks of any stat categories PrizePicks includes or introduces that measures performance based on statistics accumulated from a certain number of at bats, an individual inning or combination of innings that is not the entire game and/or any other stat category that does not measure statistics accumulated throughout the entire game.

Entrants who use one or more Eligible Squares in an entry during the Promotion Period agree to be held to these Rules as a necessary consequence of using one or more Eligible Squares in an entry.

If a PrizePicks entrant does not wish to be eligible for the Promotion, the entrant should not choose an Eligible Square for an entry during the Promotion Period.

"Less" plays are not affected by the Promotion and are not eligible for the Promotion.

Persons not eligible to make PrizePicks entries are not eligible for the Promotion.

D. How it Works

If the MLB player whose batting statistic the entrant selected in an Eligible Square has fewer than three plate appearances in the relevant official game for any reason (which may include, but is not limited to, injury, weather and/or performance) ("Reboot Square"), the entry that contains the Reboot Square will "reboot", i.e., PrizePicks will treat the Eligible Square as if it were a DNP ("Did Not Play") and the entry will revert down to the next lowest available entry, as follows:

Initial Entry	"Rebooted" Entry
6-Pick Flex	5-Pick Flex

6-Pick Power	5-Pick Power
5-Pick Flex	4-Pick Flex
5-Pick Power	4-Pick Power
4-Pick Flex	3-Pick Flex
4-Pick Power	3-Pick Power
3-Pick Flex	2-Pick Power
3-Pick Power	2-Pick Power
2-Pick Power	Refund

If an entry contains more than one Reboot Square, the entry will be reverted down the number of times that is equal to the number of Reboot Squares.

If a two-way player (or any other player) both bats and pitches in the same game, and leaves the game with fewer than three plate appearances, then any square based on their batting statistics would be a Reboot Square if it is otherwise an Eligible Square (e.g., if Shohei Ohtani pitches in a game and leaves the game after 2 plate appearances while throwing 5 innings, a square for "Ohtani more or less than 0.5 home runs" would be a Reboot Square (if it is otherwise an Eligible Square)), but any square based on their pitching statistics would not be a Reboot Square (e.g., a square for "Ohtani more or less than 5.5 strikeouts") would not be a Reboot Square, since it is based on a pitching statistic, and no squares based on pitching statistics can be Eligible Squares).

If an MLB player hits his projection as displayed in the Eligible Square before leaving the game, the Eligible Square is considered a win and is not eligible for the Promotion.

E. General Terms

Capitalized terms used in these Rules and not defined in-line shall have the meanings given to them in the PrizePicks Terms of Service, available at: [Final 2025 Terms of Service.docx](#)

Entries made during the Promotion Period are subject to all other PrizePicks rules and Terms of Service, applicable laws and regulations, and other applicable requirements in addition to these Rules. See PrizePicks Terms and Conditions for requirements related to accounts, eligibility, disqualification and cancellation, indemnification and limitations of liability, and other terms that will affect this Promotion.

These Rules may be amended by PrizePicks at any time without advance notice. An amended version of the Rules will be labeled with "AMENDED ON X", the "X" to be the date that PrizePicks amends the Rules.

PrizePicks may choose to terminate this Promotion at any time if it determines that the integrity of the Promotion is a concern.

The Promotion is void in any Eligible Jurisdiction where a regulator or law enforcement agency declares it to be void.

The Promotion is subject to any limitations and conditions placed on promotions by a regulator in an Eligible Jurisdiction.
