A Letter from the President

As Villanova Prep enters its second century of service to the Church, its future is bright. Building on a century of academic excellence, the school enjoyed an extraordinary year.

Rooted in the Augustinian intellectual tradition dating back to 1244, Villanova continues to form students in wisdom and virtue through rigorous academics, competitive athletics, and co-curricular programs that develop character and leadership.

Graduates continue to earn admission to top universities, including Ivy League schools and U.S. service academies. Members of the Class of 2025 enrolled at institutions such as Boston College, Catholic University, Claremont McKenna, Johns Hopkins, NYU, Pepperdine, Purdue, UC Berkeley, UCLA, and Villanova University. One faculty member earned a Fulbright Teacher Exchange appointment, while another's students ranked in the top 2 percent nationally on AP exams.

The 2024-25 year was also Villanova's strongest ever in fundraising, with more than \$2.8 million invested in our students. Donor support provided essential financial aid and funded major campus improvements, including new roofs for Clark Gymnasium and McGrath Hall.

As we begin the 2025-26 school year, enrollment is up 10 percent—a 15-year high.

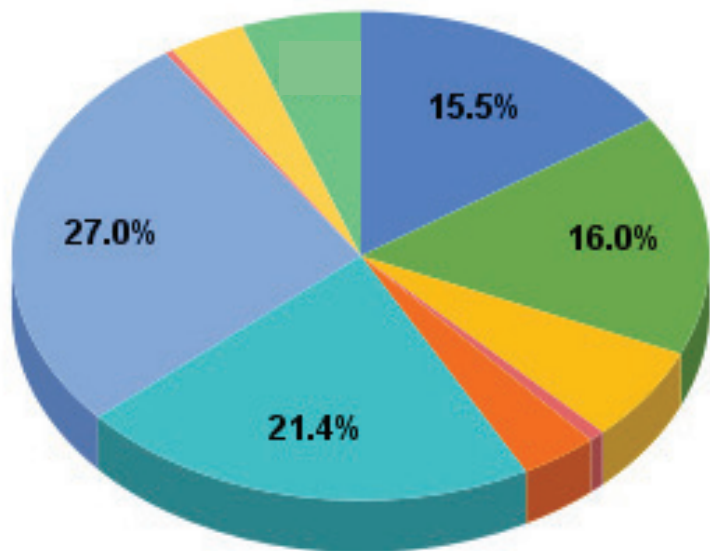

A RECORD-BREAKING DISPLAY OF VILLANOVA SPIRIT

For the first time, Villanova Preparatory School designated June as its Month of Giving—and it was nothing short of extraordinary. Our community came together with purpose and passion, raising \$233,473, making it the single largest giving month in Villanova's history.

We are proud to share that we reached 93 percent of our \$250,000 goal, an impressive achievement that reflects the deep commitment and enthusiasm of our Villanova family. Support poured in from alumni, alumni parents and grandparents, current parents and grandparents, and both current and former faculty and staff. The response was truly inspiring.

Alumni engagement was especially strong, with graduates from 35 different class years participating. Notably, 32 percent of the Class of 1975—celebrating their 50-year reunion—contributed to their milestone gift. Even more encouraging, one in five gifts came from first-time donors, demonstrating how Villanova's network continues to grow and strengthen in new ways.

Momentum soared early on thanks to a generous matching gift challenge, which was met in less than a week. This incredible boost helped sustain excitement and participation throughout the month.

We were also delighted to announce the winners of our Cruise Giveaway, Mark '91 and Molly Dufau, current Villanova parents—congratulations, and thank you for your support!

THE ST. AUGUSTINE FOUNDATION AND SHEA HOMES COME TO THE RESCUE: CLARK GYMNASIUM REOPENS THANKS TO GENEROUS GRANT SUPPORT



Villanova Preparatory School continues to be strengthened by meaningful grant support, and the 2024–25 academic year was no exception. We were deeply fortunate to receive significant financial assistance from both The St. Augustine Foundation and Shea Homes, whose generosity made it possible to reopen Clark Gymnasium in August 2024.

A structural failure discovered in the fall of 2023 rendered the gym completely inaccessible, forcing the school to go an entire year without one of its most important community spaces. Without the gym, Villanova was unable to hold indoor school Masses, athletic practices and games, physical education classes, pep rallies, and assemblies. Beloved traditions such as the Parent Auction and Las Posadas celebration had to be held off-site.

Because of our generous supporters, Villanova continues to fulfill its mission of educating and inspiring young adults of diverse backgrounds to live out the Augustinian values of truth, unity, and love.

With repair costs exceeding \$1.6 million, the support from these two organizations came as a true blessing. Their partnership made it possible for Villanova to begin repairs immediately and restore a vital part of campus life. Thanks to the expertise and dedication of McGillivray Construction, the project was completed in record time—allowing students to return to a fully restored and revitalized gym at the start of the new school year.

We extend our sincere gratitude to The St. Augustine Foundation for its unwavering, long-standing partnership and to Shea Homes as a new and valued supporter of Villanova. Their generosity has had a profound impact on the well-being of our students and the entire school community.



Centennial Celebrations

CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF AUGUSTINIAN EXCELLENCE IN OJAI, CALIFORNIA

At the request of Archbishop John Cantwell, the Augustinians opened Villanova Preparatory School on October 12, 1924, with 15 students, three faculty members, and two Augustinians on the 131-acre campus in beautiful Ojai, California. This small group began a tradition of academic and spiritual excellence in Catholic education that has endured for over a century. The initial buildings—Cantwell Hall, the boys' dorm, and Austin Hall, which housed classrooms—remain iconic cornerstones of the campus today.

From October 9-12, 2024, Villanova marked its centennial with several days of festivities, bringing together alumni, parents, grandparents, faculty, staff, and friends to celebrate 100 years of achievement and community.

The celebration began on Wednesday, October 9, with a meaningful homily delivered by Archbishop José Gomez, attended by students, faculty, staff, parents, and grandparents. Following the homily, a marble statue of St. Thomas of Villanova was dedicated, and a luncheon on the grotto lawn served over 250 guests.

On Friday, October 11, a tailgate party welcomed alumni, past and current parents, and friends of the school. Guests enjoyed a traditional BBQ and a football game under the lights, highlighting the spirit and camaraderie that define Villanova.

The week culminated on Saturday, October 12, when more than 350 alumni, parents, board members, faculty, staff, and friends attended a formal Vigil Mass led by Bishop Turley (Augustinian Bishop from Peru) followed by a plated dinner under the twinkle-light tent on the grotto lawn. The evening featured John Clark Levin '07 as Master of Ceremonies, honored longtime faculty member Tim Bunce, and included an inspirational address by Very Reverend Father Barnaby Johns, O.S.A., reflecting on Villanova's century of impact.

Development Director Sandi White closed the evening by highlighting a special task force planning for Villanova's future, ensuring the school continues to transform students' lives for the next 100 years.

A Historic Moment

POPE LEO XIV'S AUGUSTINIAN ROOTS & TIES TO OJAI

This past year brought a moment of profound pride and inspiration for the Augustinian family—and for Villanova Preparatory School—when the world welcomed Pope Leo XIV, the first pontiff in history to come from the Order of St. Augustine.

Formerly known as Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., Pope Leo XIV has long embodied the Augustinian spirit of truth, unity, and love that defines Villanova's own mission. Before his papacy, he served as Prior General of the Augustinian Order, guiding communities around the world with a deep commitment to dialogue, pastoral care, and compassionate leadership.

Pope Leo XIV's connection to Ojai is both meaningful and personal. During his years as Prior General, he visited the Villanova campus and Ojai Valley on a number of occasions, joining with local Augustinians in prayer, reflection, and fellowship. His visits left a lasting impression on those who met him—his humility, warmth, and genuine curiosity reflecting the same values that have guided Villanova since its founding in 1924. When news of his election reached Ojai in May 2025, there was a palpable sense of joy and pride across the Villanova community.

Pope Leo XIV's early words as pontiff have centered on unity, love, and the search for truth—hallmarks of the Augustinian tradition. In this new chapter for the global Church, Villanova finds renewed inspiration in its own work to form young people who think deeply, act with integrity, and serve others with open hearts.

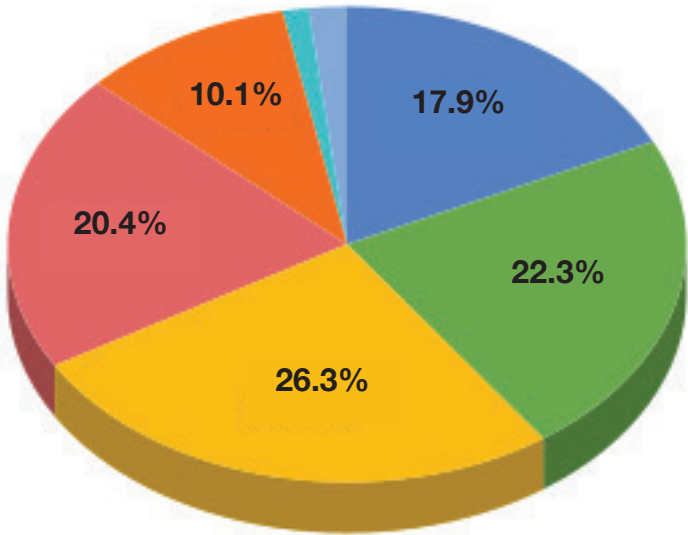
