













Scholarship Saturdays: Unlocking your Future

Ron Brown Scholar Program

Awards 20-25 four-year \$40,000 scholarships to high achieving, economically-challenged African American high school students

The Hagan Scholarship

Need-based, merit scholarship providing up to \$7,500 per semester for up to 8 semesters

Elks Most Valuable Student

Awards 500 four-year scholarships ranging from \$1000 to \$7500 per year

Dells Scholars Program

Awards a \$20,000 scholarship to 500 students with financial need every year

Jack Kent Foundation

The Foundation provides up to \$55,000 per year for up to three years for students with financial need

The Jackie Robinson Foundation

Awards graduating minority high school students up to \$35,000 over four years

Coca Cola Scholarship

A \$20,000 merit-based scholarship for graduating high school students

Questbridge

Provides high school seniors with financial need with the opportunity to match at a college with a full-ride

The Gates Scholarship

A scholarship that covers everything--tuition, fees, room and board, books, and transportation--for high achieving, low-income students

Taco Bell Live Mas Scholarship

Provides students who are planning to use their passion to create change with scholarships from \$5,000-\$25,000

Notable Narrative Advisor & Advisee Collaboration Timeline

June-July

By the end of junior year, start drafting ideas for the common app or coalition essay, establish an ideal college list of safeties, reach, and targets, and tour colleges if you have the opportunity to!

August

NN applications open! You will get more familiar with the common app/ coalition portal, draft essays and extracurriculars, and think about potential recommenders as your mentor gets to know you better.

September

Continue drafting the required supplemental essay and personal statement and finalizing your college list. This is a good time to decide whether or not you want to early decision or early action!

November

Outside of your NN mentor, we highly recommend having two to three people proofread your essays and extracurricular list, whether it is your counselor, teacher, friends! Continue applying to scholarships.

December

FAFSA opens! Finalize any materials you are still working on. Remember to ask your NN mentor any last minute college application questions. Whether your early decision or not, remember that it is okay to take breaks!
