

Guidance on funding available to victims of sexual violence

Updated 1 July 2026

The Victim Assistance Scheme (VAS) funds victims of sexual violence to help with some of the financial burden of being a victim and helps victims take part in the justice system.

Support includes grants, counselling/rongoā, and financial assistance for travel to, and attendance at, court.

VAS is administered by Victim Support on behalf of the Ministry of Justice.

Please note: Funding may differ depending on individual circumstances based on needs assessment outcomes, incident details, and reporting dates. **Victim Support makes Victim Assistance Scheme payments twice a week.**

Eligibility

Eligibility for this funding is limited to certain types of serious crimes based on their categorisation in the Crimes Act.

Examples include Rape, Sexual Attack and Intimate visual recordings.

Only Primary Victims – the person to whom the crime directly happened – are eligible.

Funding available for primary victims of Sexual Violence

A police file number is required.

Grants

A lump sum \$1,000 grant may be available to help with costs after the crime.

Available for incidents reported to police on or after 1 July 2023.

Supplementary Funding

Supplementary funding up to \$2,500 may also be available to a primary victim to help with costs associated with **safety and immediate needs**.

Available for incidents on or after 1 July 2023.

Counselling/Rongoā

A maximum of **10 counselling/rongoā hours combined** may be available if there are delays through ACC.

This would be funded from within the \$2,500 supplementary funding.

Available for incidents on or after 1 July 2023.

Travel & Accommodation Funding

Funding may be available, with limits, to help with travel and accommodation costs for:

- the primary victim
- up to three whānau, family members, or support people

This can help people attend trials, sentencing, hearings, and other justice sector proceedings.

Victim Support makes all travel and accommodation bookings.

Please note that travel for prosecution witnesses is administered by NZ Police or The Crown. Read more [here](#).

Court Attendance allowance

A court attendance allowance may be available for those who lose income because they are attending court. This might include:

- the primary victim
- up to three whānau, family members, or support people

\$150 for a full day per person

\$75 for a half day per person

Support people **must be 18 years or older.**

Please note that witnesses are paid under the *Witnesses and Interpreters Fees Regulations 1974*.

Crime Scene Funding

Up to \$2,000 may be available where a police cordon has been put in place, the police confirm they are investigating a crime and the victim has been displaced.

How to apply

You can ask for help to make a VAS application from:

- your Support Worker
- the sexual violence agency supporting you

If your application includes travel, please apply as early as possible to make sure travel can be arranged in time.
