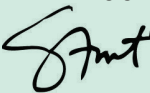
For most ministries, this is not only a time of thanksgiving, but also a time of intense prayer and hope. Many ministries are asking God to move people to be extra generous toward Kingdom work. At WHMI, we join them. The need seems large to us at WHMI; we need over \$630,000 by year end. We have learned however that God is able—as I heard a dear saint say years ago, we tell the people and trust the Lord. You have proven to be faithful partners to us—so we tell you and we trust the Lord.

If you take a moment to look through this newsletter, you will see that the impact of your gifts is producing a large harvest. The many stories we hear from the field confirm this, not only in the lives of those we train but also in the lives of those they lead. The student count at the end of Q3 was 10,799, spread across 355 locations in 57 nations. And we have graduated more than 5,300 students. If each of these leaders influence just 50 people, that is a direct impact of 750,000 people. Of course, it is much more than that; as trained pastors create healthy churches, their communities are transformed by the gospel.

For these reasons, I want to encourage you to ask God how He might lead you to be generous toward this work. And if not this work, please be generous toward other gospel proclaiming, biblically faithful ministries. Gratitude demands generosity. It recognizes that we have what we have because of God's graciousness toward us. So many of our partners truly have little in material goods but live with profound gratitude. Knowing and seeing this all around the world creates a desire in me to live with more gratitude and more generosity!
