A MOMENT OF GRATITUDE

Tony and Ann Metzner's connection to Bayley began in the mid-1990s, when his mother became a resident.

What he witnessed during those years left a lasting impression—not just of excellent care, but of a community where his mother truly felt at home. “She likely spent some of the happiest years of her life here,” Tony shares.

For Tony and Ann, Bayley represents more than a senior living community. They describe it as “a restive but active residential community with friendly staff, neighbors, and residents—many of whom are models of life fulfillment.” Their first impressions remain vivid: a beautiful campus with caring personnel, where older adults are supported as their needs change, from complete independence through long-term care.

Generosity, both big and small, has deeply shaped Tony and Ann's view of Bayley. As residents in the cottage, they have seen neighbors step in to support one another in extraordinary ways, and they have witnessed Bayley's commitment to ensuring that residents facing financial hardship throughout the campus never lose the care and dignity they deserve. “We are aware that as residents deplete their life savings, they are still treated with dignity in the same environment as others,” Tony and Ann explain.

What makes Bayley unique, in Tony and Ann's eyes, is its mission-driven heart. “This is a place where love and care come first—not profits,” they say. Staff and volunteers embody this daily, through their attentiveness to resident needs and their unwavering compassion, whether in nursing, pastoral care, or simple acts of kindness. Ann, a volunteer at Bayley, witnesses this firsthand every day.

The impact extends far beyond residents. Bayley, Tony, and Ann note that it serves as a vital source of employment, offers hands-on learning to future healthcare professionals, and provides a “zone of peace amid urbanization, and a symbol of Christian values.”

Inspired by his mother's experience, Tony, Ann, and his family have chosen to make Bayley part of their legacy through their family trust. “That alone is enough to place Bayley prominently in our giving,” he affirms.

When asked what message they would give to others considering supporting Bayley, Tony and Ann's words are simple but powerful: “There is no other place where the individual is truly put first—even as they progress beyond independent living and regardless of financial capabilities.”

I've been a West Sider my whole life, and with that comes a deep connection to the Sisters of Charity and their mission of caring for others.

My wife worked at Mount St. Joseph, and together we admired the Sisters' dedication to service and education. My family also shares in that legacy—every one of my sisters and daughters, as well as three of my granddaughters, has attended Seton High School. I am very proud of them and their school. Even at Bayley, I've found that connection lives on, as several residents, workers, and fellow board members are also Seton graduates.

Service has always been part of my calling. Over the years, I've volunteered with organizations like Santa Maria and the Price Hill community, and was honored to receive the Sister Blandina Award. After retiring as Principal of Elder High School, I was invited to join Bayley's Strategic Planning Committee, and soon after, the Board of Directors.

Over two terms, I've had the privilege of helping guide important transitions, including leadership searches and long-range planning.

One of my mom's sayings has always stayed with me: "Use all the brains God gave you and then borrow what you need." That's how I view board service. Each member brings their own expertise and life experience, and together we chart the path forward.

I've been proud to lend what I could, while also learning from the wisdom of others.

What makes Bayley truly unique is that it is the only Catholic adult community in the tri-state area. That foundation of faith shapes everything here.

Whether in the fitness club, adult day program, long-term care, or simply in everyday interactions, there's a spirit of compassion, respect, and belonging that makes Bayley feel like home. I've seen friends and former colleagues receive care here, and their gratitude only deepened my belief in Bayley.

As the baby boomer generation continues to age, the need for Bayley's mission will only grow. Families can't always provide the care their loved ones need, but Bayley offers a trusted alternative rooted in love, dignity, and community.

As I complete my final year on the board, I don't see it as an ending but a celebration—of friendships built, progress made, and a mission that will continue to flourish. I'll always be proud to have played a small part in Bayley's story.

For more than two decades, I've had the privilege of tending the outdoor spaces at Bayley Senior Care.

Most people might call it landscaping or groundskeeping, but for me, it has always been more of a calling than a job. I don't even look at it as work—it's an honor. This is one of many things residents experience each day, and I want them to see beauty every time they look outside.

My connection to Bayley began when I supervised the original landscaping for the senior care building. But my commitment grew deeper over time, because I came to see Bayley not as a business project, but as a ministry—one where residents are treated like family.

That belief has guided me in countless small ways. I remember a 40-hour snowstorm when I cleared driveways and mailboxes myself because I couldn't stand the thought of residents risking a fall. I've planted flowers for residents who couldn't manage it themselves and even reworked landscaping to protect a beloved bird feeder. These gestures may seem small, but to the people who live here, they mean everything.

Generosity has always been part of my family, too. My mother-in-law was a Bayley resident, and today she continues giving back by knitting prayer shawls for those in rehab.

I deliver them personally, and each time I'm reminded that Bayley is more than buildings and programs—it's a culture of kindness. Residents aren't just my clients. They're God's children, cared for with dignity.

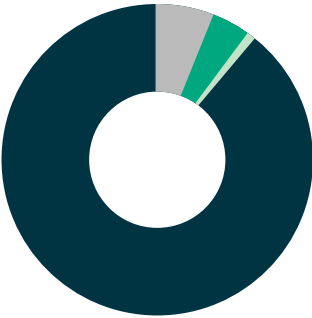
