While our setting may be new, our purpose remains the same — creating a welcoming community where residents feel supported, engaged, and inspired.

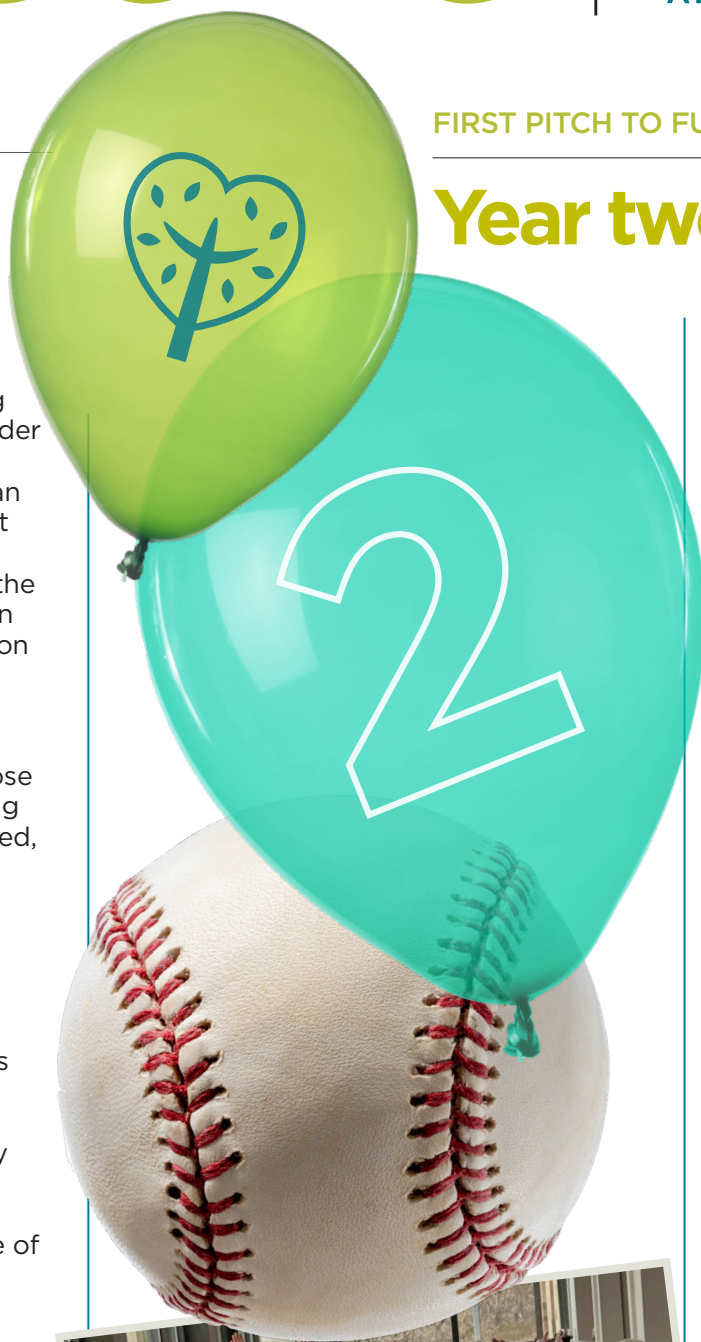
**“This year we proudly celebrate two years at Bayley at Green Township!”**

# Strawberry Shortcake



### FILLING INGREDIENTS

- 6-7 cups quartered strawberries
- 1/4 cup + 2 Tbsp granulated sugar, divided
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup heavy cream

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Stir strawberries with 1/4 cup sugar. Cover and refrigerate until juicy.
2. Beat heavy cream, remaining 2 Tbsp sugar, and vanilla until soft peaks form (about 3 minutes).

### BISCUIT INGREDIENTS

- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 4 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 3/4 cup cold unsalted butter, cubed
- 1 cup cold buttermilk
- 2 Tbsp heavy cream or buttermilk (for brushing)
- Course sugar for topping

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Mix flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Cut in butter until crumbly.
2. Add buttermilk and gently mix until dough forms.
3. Turn onto floured surface, flatten to 3/4 inch, fold dough a few times, then flatten again.
4. Cut 2 3/4-3 inch biscuits (about 10-12). Place touching on baking sheet or skillet.
5. Brush tops with cream, sprinkle with coarse sugar, and bake 18-22 minutes until golden. Cool slightly.

Assemble: Split biscuits and layer with strawberries and whipped cream. Serve immediately.
