

Example 11 – Family with More Medical Expenses

This example shows you how much a family with more medical expenses will pay for care with each of the Medical Plan options. When deciding which Medical Plan is right for you, it is important to look at your total medical and prescription drug expenses, which include what you pay for services AND what you pay in paycheck deductions for each plan.

Meet Linda

- ☐ Linda and her husband have three kids. She and her husband don't use tobacco.
- They get their annual physicals and use in-network doctors.
- □ Linda has an ongoing health condition, the family all get sick several times, and her daughter breaks her arm on the playground.
- · Let's pretend that they will need to:
 - o Get their annual physicals and the kids get their immunizations;
 - o Visit the primary care doctor twelve times during the year;
 - o Visit the specialist doctor fifteen times during the year;
 - o One round of lab work;
 - o Visit the urgent care three times;
 - o Visit the ER and have X-rays twice;
 - o Have an out-patient surgery;
 - o Fill quite a few different generic prescriptions at retail pharmacies and mail order.

The amounts shown are estimates for Linda's care under the plans. The numbers are for illustration purposes only. Please note everyone's annual physicals and the kid's immunizations were routine preventive care. So the plan covered them at 100% (shown as \$0 on the chart). All other amounts show Linda's out-of-pocket costs and assume they used in-network providers.

To calculate Linda's total cost, we added her annual out-of-pocket expenses (deductible + coinsurance and/or copayments + annual paycheck deductions) and subtracted her Company-provided HSA contributions. **The CDHP wins!**
