



Terms of Use

Purpose of these terms:

Our team made a set of icons together.

The team included:

- young adults with lived experience of stroke and aphasia,
- a graphic designer,
- speech pathologists.

We made the icons to help make documents more accessible.

These terms are to protect the icon suites:

- integrity,
- quality,
- accessibility, and
- attribution.

We also know that users may need additional graphics.

The terms below help users know how they can use the icons.

In using these icons, **I understand that:**

- You carefully chose the icon colours. This was to help visual contrast. You also co made each icon to help accessibility.

Hence, I may not:

- modify or adapt the icons in any way,
 - change the colour or resolution,
 - change the proportions or layout.
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- If I do need to alter the icons in any way, I need permission from the project team.
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- I must not use the icons in a way that suggests they are part of an expanded icon suite.
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- If I need icons for concepts that are not currently available, I may:
 1. use the provided template to create a 'label tile',
 2. fill in the form on the YSS website to suggest other icons that may be helpful,
 3. include other graphics that match the style, but I must clearly show they are not part of the icon suite.

This approach is to support flexibility and to help protect the icons.

- I will acknowledge the icon funding source and project, for example in:
 - ethics documents,
 - grant applications,
 - research documents,
 - websites,
 - videos.
- I will acknowledge the icons in the following way:

A 'Disability Access and Inclusion Funding' grant gave the funds for the icon suite. This grant was from the University of Technology Sydney. Making the icons was part of the Young Stroke Service Project, powered by the Florey Institute.
- I will not redistribute the icons directly to others. I will not share the icon suite online or in other locations. Instead, I will direct others to download the icons from the Young Stroke Service website: <https://www.youngstrokeservice.org.au>.

This is to help you understand who is using the icons and how. This approach will help future funding and expansion.
- I will not use the icons in products or services that generate revenue.

- I may receive an email asking me to give brief feedback about the icon suite and how I have used them.
- I will use the icons in a way that aligns with best practice document design. For example: I will:
 - ✓ place the icons near the related text,
 - ✓ keep the size of the icons consistent,
 - ✓ consistently place the icons in the document, for example, on the left, or on the right.
 - ✓ use the same icon once for a concept and use this same icon each time I refer to the concept etc.

In summary:

- ✓ You may use the icons as provided.
- ✓ You may include other graphics if they are clearly separate and not shown as part of this icon suite.
- ✗ You **may not** alter or adapt the icons.
- ✗ You **may not** present modified or newly created icons as part of this project's icon suite.
