



**GET OUT, LOCK OUT,
TAKE OUT**

(Run, Hide, Fight)



Get Out

- This means when it's prudent, leaving the building and the source of the threat. Fleeing the building may not always be the best option, however, if there's the possibility of a shooter outside. This can also mean evacuating an open area to get to a lockable room. In that instance, you're both **GETTING OUT** and **LOCKING OUT**.



Lock Out

- This means what it says. Keep the intruder from getting access. Don't be satisfied with a locked door alone. Create redundancy by locking, layering and reinforcing entrances. It can also mean leaving one room and going to another room. Locking the door and barricading it.

Take Out

- This means fighting the intruder by using whatever means are at your disposal. It could be classroom scissors, a fire extinguisher, a music stand, wooden blocks, chairs – anything that can stop the attacker.

Lockdown

- Prevent the intruder from getting access.
- Secure the building or rooms within it.
- Remove vulnerable people from a threat.
- Isolate the threat.
- Allow for an accurate accounting of the people in each room.
- Depending on the situation, evacuate people from the threat in an organized manner.



There are two types of lockdowns:

1. Locking the outside doors to keep an intruder out.
2. Locking inside doors (classrooms, meeting rooms, hallway access doors) to protect people from an intruder already inside.
