## SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AT THE MOVIES WEEK 3

While anyone can take time to answer these questions individually, these questions are best discussed in a group! Not in a group yet? We want you in one! Head over to **southeastchristian.org** to join a group in person or online, wherever you are - today!

As you think back over your life, what are some things that have transformed the way you live? What's one purchase/item that has changed your life? What did you do before you got that thing? How did it change the rhythms/habits of your life? Would you recommend it to another person? Why or why not?

Read Luke 9:23-26. What level of sacrifice and devotion does Jesus call for in these verses? What are some of the costs He associates with discipleship? In your opinion, do we often take these sacrifices as seriously as we ought to? Why or why not? What kind of radical transformation would these things bring into our lives?

Which would you say you value more: Comfort or Change? How do you see that value expressed in your life? Why do you think people struggle with change? What are some of the challenges/difficulties that change brings with it? How do we know if a change is worth sacrificing our comfort for?

Why does desperation often lead us to change? Why do we have to come to that place in order to really want to transform our lives? Has there ever been a time when you were desperate for a change? What brought you to that place? How did you move past it?

Read Romans 6:1-10. What does Paul say about baptism in these verses? What kind of life change happens when we commit ourselves to Jesus in baptism? How does being immersed in water symbolize that transformation? What promises does Paul attach to baptism in this passage?

This past weekend, we celebrated baptisms as a congregation. As you look back on your baptism, how has Jesus continued to transform your life since that day? Close together in prayer by asking Jesus to continue His transforming work in all those who were baptized this weekend.
