Whatever Your Role Colossians 3:18-4:1

• Colossians 3:17 - "Whatever you do... do it all in the <u>name</u> of the Lord Jesus"

Cultural Challenge

- We live in an **individualistic** culture
- Words like "submit" and "obey" can sound **oppressive** or dangerous
- But submission isn't the enemy of human flourishing it's the pathway to it
- Orchestra: Beauty comes when each instrument plays their <u>part</u> while following the same leader

Four Roles Paul Addresses:

1. In MARRIAGE - Submit as if to the Lord (3:18-19)

Verse 18: "Wives, **submit** yourselves to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord."

Verse 19: "Husbands, **love** your wives and do not be **harsh** with them."

- Love like Christ loved the church He died for her
- Not creating a dictatorship but a context where sacrificial **love** and willing **submission** work together

2. In PARENTING - Shepherd as if for the Lord (3:20-21)

Verse 20: "Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord."

Verse 21: "Fathers, do not **embitter** your children, or they will become **discouraged**."

- Don't **abuse** your authority
- Parent like God parents you with kindness and gentleness

3. In WORK - Honor as if unto the Lord (3:22-4:1)

For Employees (verses 22-25):

- Work with **excellence** not because of your boss or pay
- But because you're ultimately working for <u>Jesus</u>

For Employers (4:1):

- Treat people under your authority with fairness and respect
- You also have a **master** in heaven

4. In ALL ROLES - REMEMBER you serve the same Lord (4:1)

The Key: "because you know that you also have a Master in heaven"

This means:

- Your submission isn't weakness it's worship
- Your obedience isn't just compliance it's **character** development
- Your parenting isn't just child management it's **discipleship**
- Your work isn't just a paycheck it's ministry
- Your leadership isn't just authority it's **stewardship**

Important Clarifications:

Paul's teaching assumes everyone is:

- Following <u>Christ</u>
- Motivated by <u>love</u>
- Seeking the other person's **needs**

The gospel never calls you to:

- Enable Sin
- Endure Abuse

- 1. In what relationship are you trying to **avoid** the role God has given you?
- 2. Where are you demanding your **rights** instead of embracing your responsibilities?
- 3. What role are you treating like it's about **you** instead of serving Christ?
- 4. How would your relationships change if you believed you were serving **Jesus** in each?

The Bottom Line:

Whatever your role - embrace/fulfill it and, excel in it as if you're doing it directly for Jesus.
