

# SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

## WHATEVER YOUR STORY - DAVID NASSAR

What's your story of coming to faith? When did you first come to know Jesus? As you look back on that story, what are some of the ways you see God at work in that story? How did He know you before you knew Him?

Read Colossians 4:7-17. As you read through this list of names and greetings, what comes to your mind? How do sections like these help root the New Testament letters in a specific place and time? How does it make you feel to think of these brothers and sisters who we only know now only by this one mention of their name?

We only know about Archippus because Paul mentions him here. In the 2000 years since these words were written, how has the Gospel been spread down to us? Do you think it's largely been the work of "super evangelists" or more the work of people like Archippus? Why? How does that challenge us to share our faith in this day?

David shared the story of Aubrey Edwards and the impact he had on the Nassar family. Who has been an "Aubrey Edwards" in your story? How did their example/actions help you come to know Jesus better? How can our acts of kindness and compassion help point people to Jesus?

God wants to use your story to connect others to His story. What are some parts of your story that can help you connect with others? How have the things you've been through – both good and bad – give you an opportunity to share Jesus with the people around you?

Who is the person around you who needs the Gospel? Where has God prepared a ministry for you like He did for Archippus? As you close, spend some time in prayer together asking God to help you be faithful to the ministry He has in mind for each of you.
