

SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

IN THE BEGINNING: WEEK 2

While anyone can take time to answer these questions individually, these questions are best discussed in a group! Not in a group yet? We want you in one! Head over to southeastchristian.org to join a group in person or online, wherever you are - today!

Who in your family do you most resemble? What are some of the ways this resemblance reveals itself? How does your resemblance to family members go deeper than looks (think of things like habits/mannerisms)? Why do we tend to mimic the people we spend the most time with?

Read Genesis 1:26-31; 2:18-25. What do these passages tell us about the creation of mankind? What was so special about the ways that Adam and Eve were both created? In your opinion, what does it mean to be created in the "image of God"? What are some of the ways we ought to "resemble" God?

As Dave pointed out, God says "let us make man in our image." How does this verse give us the first hint of God existing in Trinity? Why is it significant that we see Father, Son, and Spirit at the very beginning? What does the fellowship of the Trinity teach us about our own need for community and fellowship?

What difference does it make to know that everyone is created in God's image? If you really recognized that truth, how would it change the way you interact with the people around you? How would it change the way you treat strangers? Why is it difficult for us to see God's image in other people?

How does it make you feel to know that you represent Jesus in this world? Who responsibilities/privileges come to your mind? What would it look like for us to really represent Him in all our attitudes and actions? Think through your typical day. How would Jesus handle the situations you encounter daily?

Read 2 Corinthians 2:14-17. What does this passage say about how we represent Christ? What are some of the ways people might respond to our witness? As you close, pray for one another, that God would show you each how to spread the aroma of the Gospel everywhere you go.
