# Dysfunction Junction

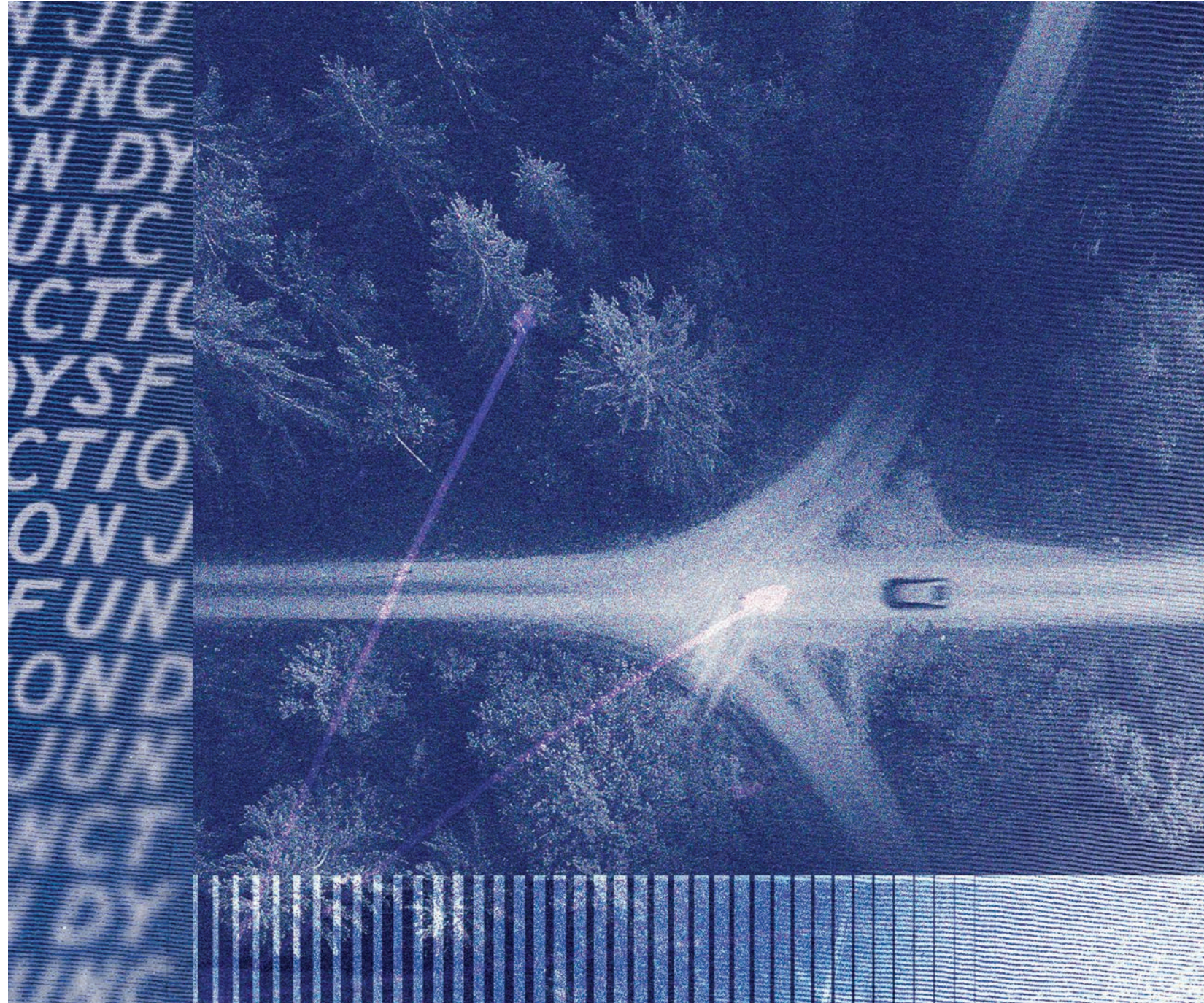
*AN INTRODUCTION TO GENESIS 12-50*

## What's This Series About?

**D**ysfunction Junction takes us into the lives of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph—the founding fathers of Israel. But this isn't a story of flawless heroes. It's the raw, honest account of real families struggling with favoritism, jealousy, deception, rivalry, and broken relationships. Yet through all the mess, we see God faithfully working out His promises and building a people for Himself.

## Why These Stories Matter

We often think the Bible's heroes must have had it all together. Genesis 12-50 shatters that illusion. These chapters show us that God doesn't wait for perfect people to accomplish His purposes—He works through flawed, broken families just like ours. Their dysfunction doesn't disqualify them; instead, it becomes the canvas on which God displays His faithfulness, grace, and redemptive power.





## The Big Picture of Genesis 12-36

### *Abraham: Faith and Family Conflict* (Genesis 12-25)

God calls Abraham to leave everything and follow Him with an extraordinary promise: he'll become a great nation, his descendants will be as numerous as the stars, and through him all nations will be blessed. But Abraham and Sarah's journey is marked by doubt, impatience,

and family conflict. Sarah's maidservant, Hagar, becomes a source of household tension. The rivalry between Ishmael and Isaac begins before Isaac is even born. Yet through it all, God remains faithful to His covenant promises.

### *Isaac and Rebekah: Parental Favoritism* (Genesis 25-27)

Isaac and Rebekah's family is fractured by favoritism from the start. Isaac favors Esau,

the rough outdoorsman; Rebekah favors Jacob, the quiet homebody. This preferential treatment breeds rivalry between the twin brothers and culminates in deception—Rebekah and Jacob conspire to steal Esau's blessing, leaving deep wounds and forcing Jacob to flee for his life. The dysfunction of one generation plants seeds for the next.

### *Jacob: Reaping What You Sow* (Genesis 28-36)

Jacob the deceiver meets his match in his uncle Laban, experiencing firsthand what it's like to be on the receiving end of trickery. Jacob works seven years for Rachel, only to be deceived into marrying Leah. The rivalry between the two sisters over their husband's affection creates a toxic home environment. Their competing attempts to win Jacob's love through childbearing introduces another generation to family dysfunction.

## Key Themes in This Series

### *Generational Dysfunction*

The same patterns of favoritism, deception, and rivalry repeat through the generations, showing how unaddressed family issues impact children and grandchildren.

### *God's Faithfulness Despite Human Failure*

Time and again, these families mess up. Yet, God's covenant promises never fail. He works through their brokenness, not in spite of it.

### *The Consequences of Sin*

Deception breeds deception. Favoritism breeds rivalry. The families in Genesis suffer real consequences for their choices, reminding us that sin always costs something.

### *Redemption and Reconciliation*

We will see some great redemption and reconciliation in some of these families. And while we're not going to get to the end of Genesis in this series, here's some more encouragement: Despite years of dysfunction, Genesis ends with forgiveness and family restoration, pointing us toward the ultimate reconciliation God offers through Christ.

## Why This Series Matters Today

Maybe you grew up in a dysfunctional family. Maybe you're watching those patterns repeat in your own relationships. Maybe you feel disqualified from God's purposes because of your family history or your own failures.

Genesis 12-36 is good news for all of us. These stories remind us that God specializes in working through messy families. He doesn't require us to have it all together before He can use us. His grace is greater than our dysfunction, His purposes more powerful than our failures, and His ability to redeem goes deeper than our most broken places.

As we journey through *Dysfunction Junction*, we'll see ourselves in these ancient families—and more importantly, we'll see a God who pursues us, remains faithful to us, and transforms us even in the midst of our mess.

# Renee's Story

*My mother contracted whooping cough when she was 5 months old, severely affecting her speech and motor skills. Because of these challenges, she was homeschooled, but her intelligence enabled her to overcome them and earn her high school diploma.*

**SHE CONTINUED LIVING** with her parents after graduation. Their pastor—a respected, married man with two teenage children—was good friends with her daddy and was frequently in their home. Momma never had any male attention, and he took advantage of the situation. She became pregnant with me and, when confronted, the pastor gave her \$1,500 and said he never wanted to hear about it again.

Unsure whether to keep me or place me for adoption—and knowing she would need help because of her physical limitations—Momma went to the Salvation Army home and hospital in Louisville. She and my granny planned to keep my paternity private, but another woman soon after became pregnant by this same pastor and publicly confronted him. She learned about my mom and brought her into the situation. The pastor resigned, but the damage was done.

After I was born, Momma moved back to her hometown, but it wasn't long before the challenge of raising a toddler became too much. I entered foster care at the age of 7. At 8, two wonderful sets of foster parents introduced me to Jesus. A year later, I moved to a children's home, where I remained until graduating from

high school. While there, church attendance was mandatory every Sunday morning and evening, as well as during revivals and other special services.

Following graduation, I was burned out on church and carried deep bitterness toward God because of my “dad.” I also felt ashamed and like a burden to my momma, so I stayed away from church for many years. That changed around 2014-15 when I was invited by a friend to Southeast's Easter service. I had no desire to attend a large church, but she wouldn't take no for an answer. Dave Stone was Senior Pastor at the time, and both he and Kyle spoke that day. Their humor and message touched my heart, and I've been attending ever since.

Coming back to church gave me a sense of community and helped ease my feeling of being alone. The fellowship within my small group has been such a blessing and has deepened my understanding of the Bible. Chapel in the Woods, along with my small group and other church friends, has become the spiritual family I needed.

My story would have had a much different ending had it not been for my foster parents opening their hearts and homes to me. While I never lost my faith in God, I did lose my faith in people. Because of my own experience, I am especially grateful for the *Family Advocacy Ministry* at Southeast, as I know firsthand the difference fostering can make in a child's life.

# Josh's Story

DURING OUR TIME THERE, we saw the children grow in their knowledge of Jesus' character and the truth of the Bible. We also saw them worshiping, reciting Scripture, and praying. It was powerful to watch the Holy Spirit at work in their hearts.

We trust that God is moving and His Word is living and active. Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit continues to transform the hearts and minds of these children and they would become the future leaders of the Church in India.

Besides the growth we witnessed in these children, we were encouraged by the fervor Christians there had to disciple and serve them. Despite facing direct cultural and political opposition to their faith, they fearlessly poured into these young people, serving as the hands and feet of Jesus.

Since beginning our MOVE journey, our church has been asking God to move in us and through

us. During my time in India, God moved in my heart by reminding me what a privilege it is to participate in His mission. He doesn't need any of us to accomplish His purposes, yet in His grace, He invites us to take part in the amazing work He is doing. What a blessing it is to know that God has called all His children to join in on His mission!

In Matthew 28:19, Jesus commands us to “go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” As a Christian, God has commissioned you to join Him on His mission. A short-term trip is an opportunity to see how God is moving around the world while serving as His hands and feet. It is a way to experience God moving in and through you.

I am incredibly thankful that I was able to experience God's power in this way, and I cannot wait to see how He continues to use this experience to transform my heart.
