





SAFETY AND SECURITY @ GOLDEN HARVEST

Neville Kurz (Board Member responsible for Safety and Security) and Egmont Coetzee (General Manager) spoke to me about this important matter. Golden Harvest makes use of Custodia Security company based in the Magaliesburg area. There are two main gate security guards, one reliever and two dog handler security guards and one reliever assigned to Golden Harvest who all work 12-hour shifts doing two days, two nights and then two days' time off. The main gate security guards control access and residents, visitors, contractors and staff. The dog handlers only do night shift and do foot patrols with a trained guard dog on two separate sections of the perimeter clocking 96 and 108 fixed clocking points respectively, each guard covering about 30 km per shift from 18:00 to 6:00. Should there be signs of tampering with the fence or something out of the ordinary, he alerts the security company control room and backup is sent to the Resort. Neville and Egmont are also informed and the incident is investigated. The same happens when someone is trying to enter through the fence, where an alarm goes off at the gate. Every morning a performance rating report for each patrolling guard is sent through to the office.

Thank you to everyone who plays a role in keeping us safe.




There are cameras at the security gate, which monitor every vehicle that enters into or departs from the Resort. It is therefore essential that vehicles stop at the entrance (boom) in order for the camera to record the people in the vehicle as well as the registration number plate. A scanner is also used to scan visitor's barcode and licence discs. A pedestrian entrance and exit were also recently added to enhance security.

SECURITY IN YOUR HOUSE

Every unit gets a panic button which is tested regularly. If a resident presses the button, an alarm goes off at the security gate, and the guard on duty will call the resident to ascertain whether it is a medical or other problem. The Clinic Sister as well as the Manager will be contacted to respond immediately to the emergency. It is therefore essential that you leave a spare key of your house at the Clinic, if there is no answer, so that they can enter your house if necessary. It is also advisable that a friend or neighbour have a spare key and to inform them if you are away from home.

BLOCK LEADER MEETING

Last month we reported about the new committee consisting of a group of volunteers who will serve as block leaders to co-ordinate each of the four blocks Golden Harvest was divided into. The block leaders will introduce themselves to every resident in their respective blocks and then serve as the go-between person between the residents and security in case of an emergency. The block leaders will also be trained to know what procedures to follow in different possible emergencies.

One of the main concerns is the Frail Care Unit and the block leaders also visited the clinic for inspection to come up with possibilities regarding safety and security and procedures to follow in case of emergency. The exits were considered and it was agreed upon that the exit on the chapel side of the clinic should be altered to simplify possible evacuation.

The block leaders will meet monthly and will update their group if necessary.

GET TO KNOW OUR RESIDENTS

Erna Barnard grew up in Krugersdorp as the second of five children. Her father owned a transport business, and as a little girl she often accompanied him on long trips in the big trucks. He was her hero, and by the time she was only ten years old, Erna could already drive one of those massive vehicles. To this day, she still proudly holds a Code 14 driver's licence.

At 15, while attending Jan de Klerk High School, a conversation with a fellow student sparked her lifelong devotion to studying the Bible. They had debated whether the biblical Sabbath should be observed on Saturday—the seventh day of the week—instead of Sunday, as most calendars suggest. That simple exchange inspired her to dive into scripture, as well as magazines and books on the subject.

One day, while walking down the street, Erna spotted a torn page from an old issue of *The Plain Truth*. On it was an advertisement for a college in Pasadena, California, offering studies in theology. She applied, but her application was rejected due to international sanctions against South Africa at the time. Instead, she was encouraged to apply to a college in England. With only average school grades, she had to pass several rigorous tests before finally being accepted to Ambassador College in England.

Visiting her parents one day, Erna was introduced to their friends. Christo and Sannie, a farming couple from Heilbron. She quickly bonded with Sannie, though Christo was reserved and she didn't get to know him well at first. Sadly, Sannie was later diagnosed with cancer and passed away. Christo continued to visit Erna's parents, and on one occasion—when Erna happened to be there—his car broke down. True to her childhood skills, Erna offered to help. As they leaned over the carburettor together, their eyes met, and love quietly blossomed. married soon after, and Erna They embraced farm life wholeheartedly. The once "city girl" soon knew everything about farming.

After Christo fell ill, the couple sold the farm and returned to Krugersdorp, where he later passed away. Not long after, Erna also lost her beloved father to a lung disease caused by years of exposure to cyanide dust from mine dumps during his truck-driving days—the same illness Erna herself is courageously facing now.

Despite these hardships, Erna's strength never wavered. A talented sportswoman, she once entered a bowls competition at Golden Harvest, where she discovered the Frail Care unit. She arranged for her mother, Gertie Barnard—an accomplished contralto who had taken singing lessons in her youth with Mimi Coertze—to move into the Clinic.

Erna visited her mother often and eventually bought a unit at Golden Harvest, where she still lives today.

Devoted as ever to her faith, she spends six to eight hours every Saturday studying the Bible. She has meticulously kept a record of all the residents who have ever lived in Golden Harvest and even wrote a comprehensive history of the resort.

To all of us here at Golden Harvest, Erna is known as a Good Samaritan—though a strict one—always ready to lend a hand. She still loves driving and often volunteers to drive the Golden Harvest bus to transport residents.

Erna, we thank you for your kindness, your dedication, and the many ways you continue to enrich our community.

BOOK REVIEW





Hennie Schietekat reviewed our book of the month: *Dwelm* by *Rudie van Rensburg*.

Dwelm is a gritty detective story set in Cape Town, steeped in the atmosphere and tension of the Cape Flats. Captain Kassie Kasselman and his sharp-witted colleague, Warrant Officer Rooi Els, are called in to investigate the brutal murder of two retired detectives found dead at a dam near Paarl. At first, it appears to be a case of robbery—but Kassie suspects a far more sinister motive: revenge.


To uncover the truth, the pair dig into the victims' old case files, unearthing a trail of enemies and buried secrets. Their investigation leads them into the heart of a dangerous drug syndicate—where crime, corruption, and corporate power collide. Tensions soar when Kassie discovers a shocking connection: his fiancée's son is part of the gang he's trying to bring down. As the case spirals, so does Kassie's personal life. His fiancée is furious to learn he's been protecting her son, and the emotional fallout threatens to tear them apart. The story twists and turns as suspects emerge and fall away, leaving readers constantly second-guessing.

With its fast-paced action, raw language, and vivid portrayal of Cape Town's underworld, *Dwelm* keeps you on edge until the final reveal. In the end, the killer is unmasked. Love gets a second chance when Kassie's fiancée finds it in her heart to forgive him—and her son—for the lies and betrayal.

Dwelm is an action-packed, emotionally charged crime novel that pulls readers into a world of loyalty, vengeance, and redemption—where nothing is as it seems.

Spotlight on Hobbies

JOHAN KRUGER



Today, Johan still enjoys working with unusual pieces of wood, crafting them into not only pens but also lamps and vases. Each piece of wood has its own story, and Johan takes pleasure in giving it new life through his creations.

He first learned the art of pen-making from a craftsman who now runs a shop in Randburg —a place Johan still visits regularly to find refills. the special clips, and components that bring his pens together. Over the years, he has built up his own collection of specialist tools, including a smaller lathe that was given to him as a gift when he left the police force. That lathe now has a special place in his workshop, helping him transform small blocks of wood into something both useful and beautiful.





The process itself is one of care and patience. A short length of wood is placed on the lathe, shaped into the smooth curves of a pen, then carefully sanded and sealed. Johan often uses wax, oil, or even super glue to protect the wood and bring out its natural shine.

Finally, the components are added, each one fitted with precision, until the pen is complete. This pen made from Purple Heart wood, its rich colour and polished finish a reminder of why he fell in love with this craft in the first place.

For Johan, every pen is more than just an object—it's a piece of craftsmanship, a story captured in wood.
