DEAR CPC,

This past year, our church family has been living into a simple but stretching focus: **Invitation.**

This has included inviting people to church, but also inviting people into your life and into a life with Jesus. And just as importantly, we've been learning to live as people who are open to His invitation to us.

We've called it the "Practice of Invitation," and we've seen it take root in real, tangible ways. People praying (by name!) for friends, neighbors, and family members to know Jesus. Courageous conversations that started with a simple step of faith. Invitations extended to Alpha, where questions are welcomed and the Gospel is encountered in a personal way.

And I have personally witnessed and heard that the most transformative part of all this is what's happened in us.

Because invitation always involves trust. It asks us to believe that God is already at work in the lives of others. It asks us to step beyond comfort, to risk a little awkwardness, and to trust that the Spirit meets us there. And again and again, we've seen that He does.

Your generosity has been a meaningful part of this story. It has helped create space where people can explore faith, experience belonging, and encounter the living God. But even more than that, it has been a reflection of open-handed lives, willing to join in what God is doing.

So, as you reflect on this year, here's a simple question to carry with you: **Who might God be inviting you to invite?**

Because the Gospel is still moving. And as we say yes to the Practice of Invitation, we're discovering that God doesn't just work through us. He continues to shape us, too.

As we look at this past year, what we're really seeing is a pattern. **God shaping us through practices that help us live open to His movement.** And in all of it, I'm reminded how good it is that we get to do this together. **Thank you.**

OUR SHARED PRACTICES OF OPENNESS

To cultivate a posture of **openness**, we embrace four shared practices that help position us to anticipate and respond to God's power and presence wherever we go.

Two years ago, we focused on the Practice of Relationship. This past year, we focused on the **Practice of Invitation**. This coming year, we will focus on the Practice of Integration. And the following year, we will focus on the Practice of Reflection.

Together, these practices form a rhythm that shapes not just what we do, but who we are becoming as a church.



INVITATION

PRACTICE OF INVITATION

The Gospel moves through invitation.

Just as God extends the invitation of the Gospel to each of us, He calls us to invite others to experience the Good News of Jesus' love. Through practices of invitation, we grow in trust that God transforms lives beyond what we could ask or imagine.

PRACTICE OF RELATIONSHIP

The Gospel moves among God's people.

Connecting with others in intentional, regular spiritual conversation helps expand and deepen our understanding of the role of Jesus in our lives. Through Practices of Relationship, we learn and grow alongside one another in ways we cannot on our own.

Take a Next Step

Have intentional spiritual conversations with a spiritual companion.

PRACTICE OF INTEGRATION

The Gospel moves in every corner of life.

What happens in church isn't meant to stay in church. God is already present in every place we live, work, and play, and He invites us to join Him there. Through Practices of Integration, we learn to recognize and respond to His presence in everyday life.

Take a Next Step

Name a space in your life where you want to become more aware of God's presence.

PRACTICE OF REFLECTION

The Gospel moves through God's Word.

Reflecting on what God says and what it means for our lives helps open us to growth in our relationship with God. Through Practices of Reflection, we become more aware of why and how God is moving.

Engage regularly with Scripture through our Bible Reading Plan.



MAKING ROOM FOR HOW THE GOSPEL IS MOVING

Making room is what Invitation looks like when it becomes real.

This past year, as we practiced Invitation, God kept bringing people. More families walked through our doors. More students showed up on Sunday mornings. More people accepted invitations from friends, explored faith, and found community at CPC.

In response, CPC moved from two Sunday services to three services beginning February 22.

This change wasn't simply about attendance or schedules. It was about making room for what God is already doing. Adding a third service creates more opportunities for people to worship, connect, serve, and belong while creating additional space for kids and families. It was an act of invitation to creating space and trusting that God is transforming lives in ways beyond what we could ask or imagine.

We believe worship through music is a powerful way to experience God and respond to His movement in our lives and community. This year, the CPC Arts Series hosted three concerts with CPC members and local musicians, creating space for beauty, reflection, and invitation beyond Sunday worship.

Choirs, bells, worship teams, student musicians, and guest artists led our church in worship at each of the three events. As the CPC Arts Series grows, we pray it continues to help people encounter God through music and reflect on His work among us.

This past year we tried a new initiative by handing out invitations to Kids Choir at Trunk or Treat. Those invitations reached further than our congregation and brought new families to participate.

ALPHA

One of the clearest ways we practiced Invitation this year was through Alpha, which creates space for people to explore life, faith, and Jesus in a welcoming environment. This year, we hosted our largest Alpha with over 80 participants, launched Alpha for 60+ with over 40 seniors, and Alpha Marriage with over 40 people. Every CPC staff member also participated in Alpha. Alpha continues to show how simple invitations can lead to meaningful transformation, made possible by volunteers who serve through hospitality, prayer, meals, and conversation.

MOSAIC

An inclusive, participatory worship community designed for members of the disability community and their families. Through live music, prayer, storytelling, and a short Bible-based message, Mosaic creates a sacred space where everyone is welcomed and valued.

This year, Mosaic has continued to grow, now regularly welcoming around 80 people on Sunday mornings. We've also seen meaningful connection form through new opportunities like Cooking Club, which pairs neurotypical high school students with neurodivergent students and adults for friendship, fun, and community.

SMALL GROUPS

Small Groups meet regularly to build relationships, reflect on Scripture, and integrate faith into our everyday lives. Building on last year's momentum, we offered a 3-week Small Group Launch in the fall with nearly 130 participants. **Six out of eight small groups continue to meet regularly following the launch.**

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SMALL GROUPS

WOMEN'S MINISTRIES

This year, 1,119 women participated in a women's event, class, or small group at CPC. One highlight was the Women's Christmas Event, where more than 500 women, ages 11 to 95, gathered for an evening of worship, reflection, and connection as they entered the Advent season together. These gatherings continue to be meaningful opportunities for women to invite friends and neighbors into community at CPC, and we celebrate the way God is working through intergenerational relationships to encourage and transform lives.

Mom's Morning also experienced incredible growth this year, with **143 moms participating, a 39% increase** from the previous year. Through invitation, new relationships are forming, women are finding belonging, and families are experiencing the love of Jesus through community.

MEN'S MINISTRY

Through CPC Men's Ministry, men are finding meaningful community and encouragement in every season of life. This year, we launched quarterly CPC Men's gatherings featuring food, worship, teaching, and table discussion that help men build relationships and reflect on how God is moving in everyday life.

One highlight of the year was the Men's Christmas Breakfast, where 180 men gathered across generations for connection, conversation, and worship.

YOUNG ADULTS

Over the past year, more than 60 young adults participated in happy hours, serving opportunities, social gatherings, and Bible studies designed to foster connection and community. **Tuesday night studies alone had 44 sign-ups** across two groups, creating space for deeper discipleship and spiritual conversation. From invitational gatherings to intentional community, we are grateful to see God forming a vibrant and growing young adult community at CPC.

SENIOR ADULTS

Senior adults continue to play a vital role in the life of CPC through their faithfulness, encouragement, and investment in others. Through gatherings, classes, and care ministries, we create spaces for seniors to connect and remain open to how the Gospel is moving in every stage of life.

This year, we saw meaningful growth through invitation, with more people participating in gatherings like Edynamoses, Alpha 60+, and care groups. Through these communities, senior adults are building friendships, deepening faith, and encouraging the broader church family.

FAITH & WORK

Faith & Work is a nine-month discipleship cohort that helps participants explore what it looks like to follow Jesus in the everyday places God has called them through their work, relationships, and responsibilities. Whether early in a career or navigating a season of transition, participants are invited to reflect on how God is at work through their vocation. This year's cohort equipped CPCers to steward their gifts, pursue redemptive work, and partner with the Holy Spirit in the renewal of all things.

SCHOOL YEAR PROGRAMMING

CPC Kids continues to grow through the practice of invitation as new families find belonging and community each week. Following the transition to three Sunday morning services, average kids attendance **increased from 165 to 199 kids each Sunday**. Across every age and stage, children are learning about the love of Jesus through worship, teaching, small groups, and caring leaders.

SUMMER PROGRAMMING

Summer at CPC creates opportunities for kids and families to connect, grow in faith, and invite friends into community. Last summer, more than 221 kids attended VBS with 150+ students and adults serving throughout the week to create a fun, welcoming, and Jesus-centered experience.

SCHOOL YEAR PROGRAMMING

Student Ministries continues to grow as students invite friends into community and deepen their faith together. Across middle and high school ministries, average Wednesday night attendance reached 215 students, with more than 500 students registered across programs this year. Through worship, teaching, small groups, retreats, and camps, students are experiencing belonging, spiritual growth, and meaningful relationships with leaders and peers.

STUDENT LEADERS

The Student Leadership program helps high school students grow as leaders while serving throughout the life of CPC. This year, **84 student leaders** served across Kids Ministries, Mosaic, SIX8, Hospitality, and other ministry areas, using their gifts to help others experience the love of Jesus.

COLLEGE

College is a season of significant growth, transition, and discovery. We continue walking alongside students as they navigate new experiences, deepen their faith, and remain open to how God is moving in their lives wherever they are. Through invitation and intentional connection, CPC stays engaged with students both on campus and at home.

In 2026, invitations for summer college events were sent to **191 COLLEGE STUDENTS**, helping students stay connected in community throughout the summer months.

Care packages were sent to more than **70 COLLEGE STUDENTS** across the country as a tangible reminder that their church family is thinking of them, praying for them, and continuing to care for them wherever they are.



INTERNS

For over 30 years, CPC has offered internships that equip college-aged students for ministry and nonprofit work while fostering their spiritual and professional growth. This year we had **7 SUMMER INTERNS AND 1 SCHOOL YEAR INTERN**. They served across multiple ministry areas including worship, communications, groups, students, and kids.



CPC CONTINUES TO GIVE 10% OF OUR TOTAL GIVING TO OUR MISSION PARTNERS.

\$620,000 was sent outside our walls locally and globally. Our shared generosity reflects our commitment to seeing the Gospel move further out through both giving and participation.

This year we saw strong momentum in engagement through increased participation in Serving Saturdays, over 100 CPCers took part in hands-on local service.

In response to the unrest in our community starting in January, we have been able to come alongside our local mission partners in tangible ways. We utilized our Crisis Relief Fund to provide \$92,000 in financial support to seven local organizations. These funds have helped purchase groceries, offered rental assistance, and supported people impacted with their everyday needs.

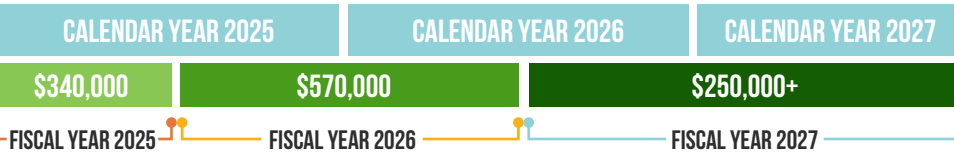

We continue on our journey of generosity together as a community. We're so grateful for CPC givers – mostly because we're shifting how we think about what God has given us as a people and a church to be more generous and that means we are being open to the movement of the Gospel in our giving! We will increase giving again in 2027 and that increase will mean growth of \$1,000,000 in giving over the last 3 years. More than a financial milestone, this reflects a community choosing to invest in what God is doing through and beyond CPC and trusting Him with our future growth.
