ACTIVITY OUTLOOK & INDICATIVE TIMELINE

Firstly, thank you to everyone in Wells who attended our Community Update on May 27. We appreciate you taking the time to join us! With Osisko Development's recent Optimized Feasibility Study and the announcement of some of the financing to advance the Cariboo Gold Project through important preconstruction activities toward construction readiness, we want to provide some more information regarding upcoming on-site activity.

The main focus of activity for now will be Detailed Engineering work on various Project components as well as a few pre-construction activities that will take place at Bonanza Ledge. This is all part of the preparations for Project construction. At this time, there should not be an increase in activity at the Mine Site Complex location.

Please note that this indicative timeline is subject to change and contingent upon a formal investment decision for the Project's construction.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

Situated on the unceded, traditional territory of the Lhtako Dené First Nation, the Sunset Theatre is one of the original buildings built in Wells in 1934! It opened December 6, 1934 as a movie house and also hosted live performances. Rumour has it, Fred Wells insisted that his miners would follow 2 rules: (1) they couldn't drink, and (2) they should be able to play a musical instrument. What a treat to have been able to see those first community concerts at The Sunset!

In 1999 the current owner, Karen Jeffery, bought the Sunset Theatre from the Wells Historical Society, and she and her husband, Dave, lovingly restored it beyond its former glory.

The theatre is managed by The Sunset Theatre Society, which reached its quarter century mark this past spring! The Society exists to create, produce, and present live Professional Theatre for the artistic nourishment of Wells community members, visitors, and artists from across Canada and International

locales. While their focus is live theatre, the Sunset Theatre also hosts music concerts, films, and dances.



safety equipment, and support


the creation and implementation of safety protocols. He is also a member of our Mine Rescue Team!

Sr. Modelling Geologist Jody joined the CGP Exploration team in January of 2021, as a Project Geologist. Over time she transitioned to modelling, creating 3D maps and models

of the various rocks, faults, and of course gold veins. In her current role as Sr. Modeling Geologist, Jody is also taking on some of the responsibilities of a resource geologist and will become responsible for running estimations and technical studies as well. Along with this new role, she is taking a course on Applied Geo-statistics; a branch of statistics that analyzes and models spatial and spatiotemporal data. What does this mean? It's the work done to estimate ore reserves and the understanding of spatial variations in mineral deposits.

Jody says modelling requires the ability to visualize geologic processes over time and how they relate back to statistical distributions and rock properties. She believes "there are many ways to approach a new problem, and it's fun to come up with new ideas." This is what she likes most about her job, saying "it allows me to use my love of both math and art, as well as my passion for solving puzzles."

When Jody's not at work, she enjoys new adventures through international travel and has been to several amazing places, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Mexico, Colombia, Japan, Taiwan, and the Caribbean, just to name a few. However, her favourite places are Sendai in Japan, known as the city of trees (also where you can find the best edamame shake!), and Jiufen in Taiwan, a whimsical mountain village with great

tea places. Jody also likes to spend time drawing, painting, playing video games, baking, and drinking tea. Speaking of tea! Jody is happy to announce she is getting married to her Taiwanese fiancée, Chris, this August and is having high tea for her bachelorette party.
