

ACTIVITY UPDATE

We would like to make the community aware of upcoming activities at the Mine Site Complex (MSC) area that will be starting over the next 6 weeks. Please refer to the image below which outlines the areas where work will be taking place.

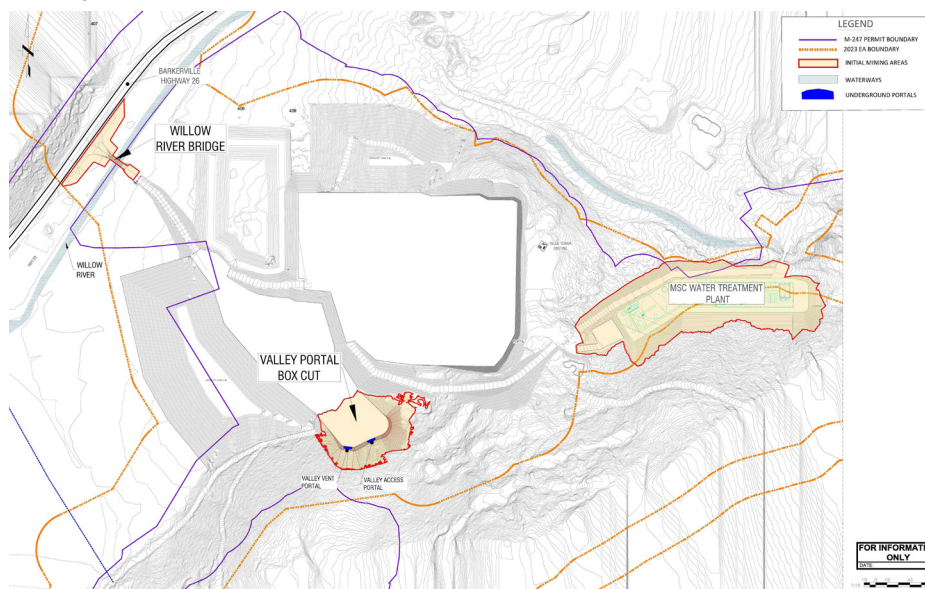
The Valley Portal: Work in this area will include establishing temporary ditching and removing overburden to the approved stockpiled location. There will also be line drilling of the high wall and excavation for the Portal. Once the work advances to the point where drill and blast activities are required, we will provide a further update to the community in advance of such work.

The MSC Water Treatment Plant: Work for this project will start in the EAC 2023 boundary for removing overburden and bringing in aggregate for the structural fill. We will provide updates as this work progresses.

Lake Geotechnical Program: This work will be taking place on the Jack of Clubs Lake. Mobilization for this work is expected to begin around July 27 at the pull-out at the end of the lake. Geotechnical drilling work on the lake, from a deck barge, is expected to begin on August 3.

The Willow River Bridge: Once initiated, this project is expected to take approximately 3-4 weeks to complete. Gravel pads will be built on both sides of the crossing, a temporary bridge will be installed to gain access to the south side and 8 piles will be driven. The B Lot will be used as the staging ground for equipment and some materials. Please note: there is currently no set start date for this work; we will provide a further update once timing is confirmed.
